REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS IS NECESSARY IN ILLINOIS

Parents Should Take Responsibility of Making Sure That Birth Certificate is Issued.

Illinois has been admitted to the Registration Area by the U. S. Bureau of the Census as to death reports but not as to births.

The Division of Vital Statistics, State Department of Health, has compiled a very complete table of infant mortality.

This information, complete as it is, does not enable the Division of Vital Statistics to announce the infant death rate for the reason that the birth record is incomplete.

A birth certificate, as it may be needed to establish proof of age for entering or leaving school, for entering military service, for securing working permit, for securing marriage license, for holding public office, to secure passports, to adjust insurance, to establish rights to inheritance of property and to secure other financial benefits, should be a matter not only of family, but of community pride.

COUNTY FARM BUREAU ONE OF 2,000 IN THE U. S.

Farm Bureau Movement, Mighty in Agriculture, Only Ten Years in the Field.

DuPage County is one of the 2,000 out of 2,800 counties in the United States which have county farm bureau agents, and which are, on the 20th of this month, recalling that the farm bureau movement, mighty as it is, is only ten years old.

On March 20th, 1911, J. H. Barron began as county agent in Broom County, New York. Today, all but two of the forty-eight states of the union have organized state bureaus which are cooperating with the American Farm Bureau Federation.

The first state farm bureau was limited strictly to educational work. Today, in Illinois, the Illinois Agricultural Association looks after the legal, business, educational and legislative interests of 106,000 farmers.
