NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons interested and to all whom it may concern that a petition has been filed in the County Court of DuPage County, in pursuance to an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act to create sanitary districts and to provide for sewage disposal" approved June 22, 1917, in force July, 1917, and all Acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, for the organization of a sanitary district including the entire incorporated Village of Downers Grove, Illinois, the external boundaries of said territory being as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Section Nine (9), Township Thirty-eight (38), North, Range 11, East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence easterly along the south line of said Section Nine to the east line of said Section Nine; thence north on said east line of Section Nine and continuing north on the east line of Section Four (4), Township 38, North, Range 11, East of the Third Principal Meridian, to its intersection with the center line of the Plank Road, otherwise known as Ogden Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of said Plank Road to its intersection with the center line of Belmont Road, otherwise known as Commercial Avenue, on plat of "Brangar Bros." "Wooded Homestead"; thence southerly along the center line of said Belmont Road to its intersection with the center line of Maple Avenue, otherwise known as the Naperville and Chicago Road; thence easterly along the center line of said Maple Avenue to the west line of "Bang's Subdivision"; thence southerly along said west line to the south line of said "Bang's Subdivision"; thence easterly along said south line to the center line of Dunham Street; thence southerly along the center line of said Dunham Street, being the west line of "Brangar Bros. Downers Grove Farm"; to the north line of the southeast quarter (SE 1/4) of Section Eighteen (18), Township 38, North, Range 11, East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence easterly along said north line and continuing easterly along the south line of the northwest quarter (NW 1/4) of Section Seventeen (17), Township 38, North, Range 11, East of the Third Principal Meridian to the center line of Main Street; thence northerly along the center line of Main Street to the south line of "Linden Heights Subdivision"; thence easterly along said south line of "Linden Heights Subdivision" to the west line of "Hedges' Addition to the City of Downers Grove"; thence southerly along said west line to the center of Section Seventeen (17), Township 38, North, Range 11, East of the Third Principal Meridian; thence easterly along the east and west center lines of said Section Seventeen (17) to the east line of said Section Seventeen (17); thence northerly along the said east line of Section Seventeen (17) to the place of beginning; all situated in Downers Grove and Little Downers, Illinois.

All of said territory be situated in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois. That a hearing upon said petition will be had in the County Court of DuPage County as in and by said Act provided on the 18th day of April, A. D. 1921, at the hour of the o'clock a. m. or as soon thereafter as the business of the Court will permit.
