> A statement issued by the office of Louis L. Emmerson, Secretary of State, on March 16th, regarding automobile licenses shows that DuPage County paid \$41,776.50 into the state treasury for auto fees during the year 1920. The increase over 1919 when the county paid \$22,879.99 was \$18,896.51, almost double the amount.

The report estimates that 4,096 cars were owned by DuPage County people in 1920 and 9,583 in 1919, an increase of only 513. The additional fees and the buying of higher horse powered cars is responsible for the all persons interested and to all big increase in the total fees.
