Minutes of the meeting of March 14th, 1921, were read and Commissioner Heartt moved to approve same. On roll call Commissioners Heartt, Bender, Bryce, Haller and Mayor Barber voted Aye. Nays none. Motion carried.

PETITION FOR ANNEXATION The undersigned, respectfully represents that he is the sole owner of the real estate known as Bunge's Subdivision of a part of the Northeast Quarter of Section 18, Township 38, North, Range 11, East of the Third Principle Meridian, County of DuPage and State of Illinois; that said property is contiguous to the limits of the said Village of Downers Grove, but is not embraced within its limits, said property being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the quarter section stone in the north line of said Section 18, and running thence south along the quarter section line 265.5 feet to a point on the center of Maple Avenue; thence north 79 degrees 48 minutes East, along the center of Maple Avenue 267 feet for a place

of beginning; thence south 33 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 21 in Block 3 of Holcomb's Subdivision of a part of said quarter section; thence south 2 degrees 31 minutes East, 156.75 feet to the southeast corner of said Lot; thence south 87 degrees 29 minutes West, 50 feet to the east line of Plymouth Street; thence south 2 degrees 31 minutes East, along the east line of Plymouth Street 1508.5 feet to the north line of Washington Avenue; thence North 87 degrees 29 minutes East, along the north line of Washington Avenue, 762 feet; thence south 66

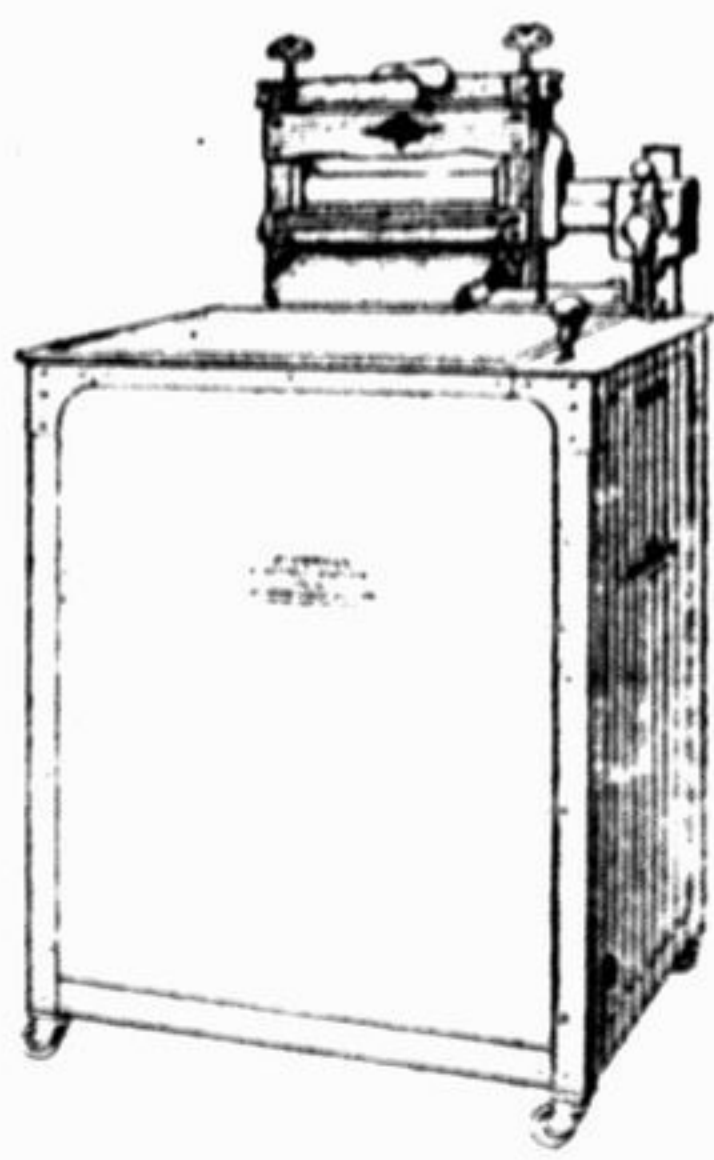
