Then the preacher said Mr. Whitten had a few words to say saw a rather slender man of 35 years advance to the front. He had not talked two minutes before I felt the tears coming to my eyes and in another minute I felt them running down my cheeks. I felt ashamed of myself for crying but when I looked up I saw that most of the congregation were doing the same thing. It seems that Mr. Whitten was selected by the church to present a watch to Miss Flossie Watts, yho had played the organ there for fifteen years. It was his presentation speech that he moved me so deeply.

He spoke of childhood days, of the American soldier and of the Soldiers of the Cross. He pictured Miss Watts as a true soldier of the Cross who all through the fifteen years by her acts had said "Oh Man of Galilee I will not fail Thee." It seems this was too much for Miss Watts for she broke down completely.

Once more I say it was a most wonderful day for me. And when I move out to your town I surely will pay another visit to the little Church in the Wild Woods for I want to hear them sing again and I want to shake hands with Mr. Whitten and Miss Watts.


