OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD

Downers Grove, Ill., April 25, 1921.
Regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, Ill. Present at roll call Mayor W. C. Barber and Commissioners Bender, Bryce, and Heardt, Commissioner Haller absent.

Minutes of the meeting of April 18th, 1921, were read and Commissioner Bender moved to approve the same. On roll call Commissioners Bender, Bryce, Heardt and Mayor Barber voted Aye. Nays none. Motion carried.

A canvas was made of the Tally Sheets and Poll Books of the Municipal Election held in Downers Grove, Illinois, on April 19th, 1921, for the election of three Directors for the Downers Grove Public Library, and submitting the question "Shall a certain tract of land, known as Bunge's Subdivision, be annexed to the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage, State of Illinois," which showed the following vote cast:

Against the proposition—Men, 37 votes; Women, 11 votes; Total, 48 votes.

Commissioner Bryce presented the following ordinance and moved for its passage:

AN ORDINANCE

WHEREAS it appears to the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage, and State of Illinois, that heretofore a petition was presented to it for the annexation of certain contiguous territory, the external boundaries of which are as follows, to-wit:

That part of the northeast quarter of Section 18, Township 28, North, Range 11, East of the 3d Principal Meridian, (described as follows: commencing at the quarter section post in the north line of Section 18, and running thence south along the quarter section line 265.5 feet to a point in the center of Maple Avenue; thence north 82 3/4 degrees east along the center of Maple Avenue 267 feet for a place of beginning; thence south 33 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 21 in Block 3 in Halcomb's Subdivision of part of said quarter section; thence south 150

feet along the east line of said Lot 21 to the southeast corner thereof; thence west along the south line of said Lot 21, 50 feet to the east line of Plymouth St.; thence south along the east line of said Plymouth Street 1508.5 feet to the north line of Washington Avenue; thence east on the north line of Washington Avenue 762 feet; thence south 66 feet to the south line of Washington Avenue; thence east along the south line of Washington Avenue extended 324.6 feet more or less to the center of Dunham Street; thence north along the center of Dunham Street 1951.7 feet to the section line; thence west along Section line 300 feet more or less to the center of Maple Avenue; thence south 61 degrees west in the center of said Maple Avenue 320 feet; thence south 82 3/4 degrees west a long center of Maple Avenue 496 feet to a place of beginning, situated in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois;

(which said territory is accurately described in the map hereto attached, and made a part of this ordinance):

AND WHEREAS, it further appears that the question of said annexation was submitted to the legal voters of said Village at a general election held in and for said Village, on the 19th day of April, A. D., 1921, and that a majority of all the votes cast at said election were in favor of said annexation, and that said petition and the election held in pursuance thereof were in all respects in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of said Village of Downers Grove: SECTION 1. That the territory herein described be and is hereby annexed to the Village of Downers Grove, in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois:

SECTION 2. That the Mayor of said Village of Downers Grove, be and he is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this ordinance in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the said County of DuPage, as directed in and by an act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled "An act to provide for annexing and excluding territory to and from cities, towns and villages, and to unite cities, towns and villages" approved April 10th, 1872, in force July 1, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage, as provided by law.
