LACE NEWS

A large and appreciative audience filled the Lace Church Sunday evening to enjoy the program given under the auspices of the Luther League. The following soloists were engaged for the occasion. Miss Emma Buremister, vocal soloist of Redeemer Lutheran Church, Chicago; Miss Irene Andermann, violin, of Hinsdale and Prof. R. J. Schultz, who is organist of Zion Lutheran Church, Hinsdale.

The service was given by the Young People to celebrate their first anniversary as members of the Walther League. This League is an organization of Lutheran Young People's Societies and is named after Dr. C. F. Walther, whose name has become associated with the great names of the Christian Church. It was under his leadership, that there came into

being that staunch body of Lutherans known as the Missouri Synod. While Walther lived he was the soul of this Synod and though he is dead nearly thirty years, his influence still lives among the members of this Synod and which has made it the largest of all Lutheran bodies.

The territory of the Walther League now includes almost every state in the Union and extends even beyond the boundaries of the United States into Canada. At present the League comprises about 700 Societies.

The aims of this League are to keep the young people with their church through their various societies and to help in furthering Christian love and fellowship in and among the different societies and establishing a closer outward union among them. At present the League is aiding in erecting a large and modern Sanitarium at Wheat Ridge,

near Denver, Colorado. The League also takes great interest in missionary and charitable endeavors at home and abroad.

The local society has taken an active interest in all affairs of the League and has been of great help to the Home Church as well as aiding the affairs and endeavors of their

League. The next international convention will be held in Milwaukee during July and the Lace Local will elect their delegates in the June meeting.

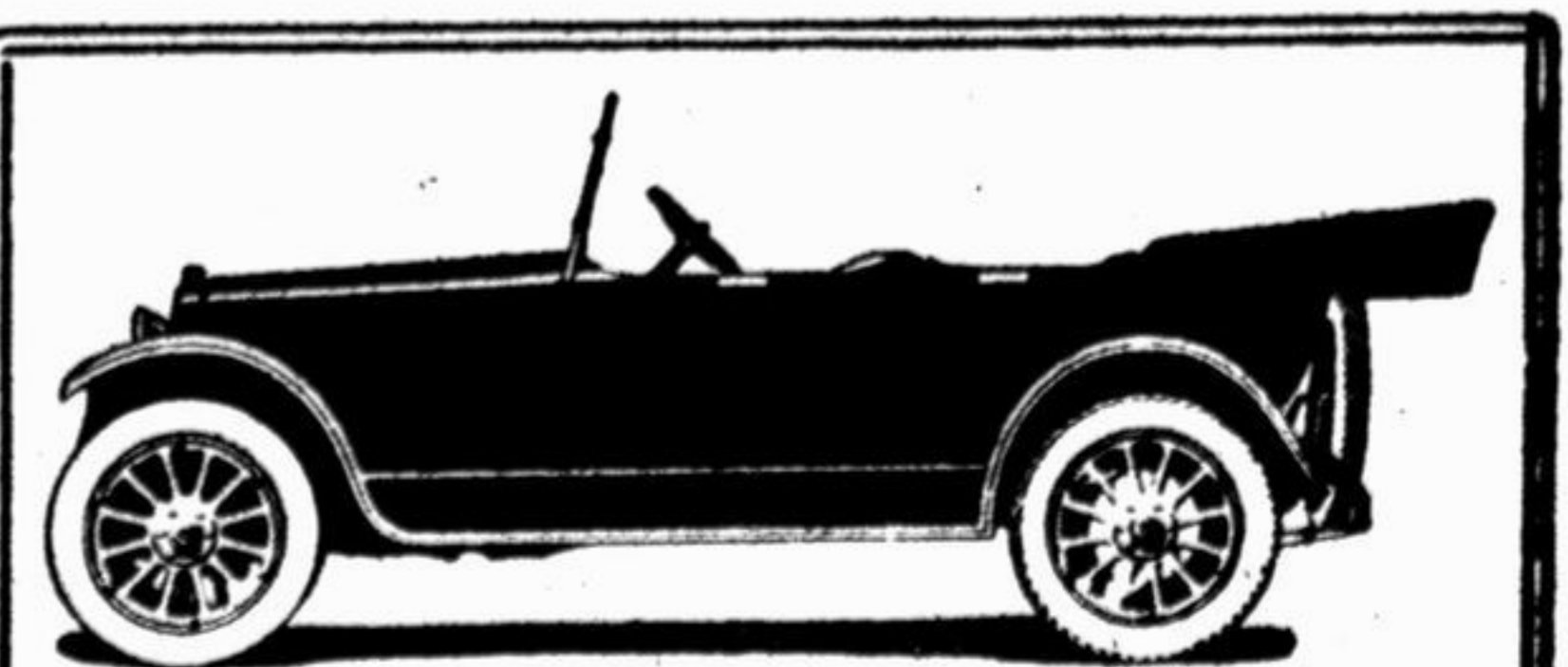

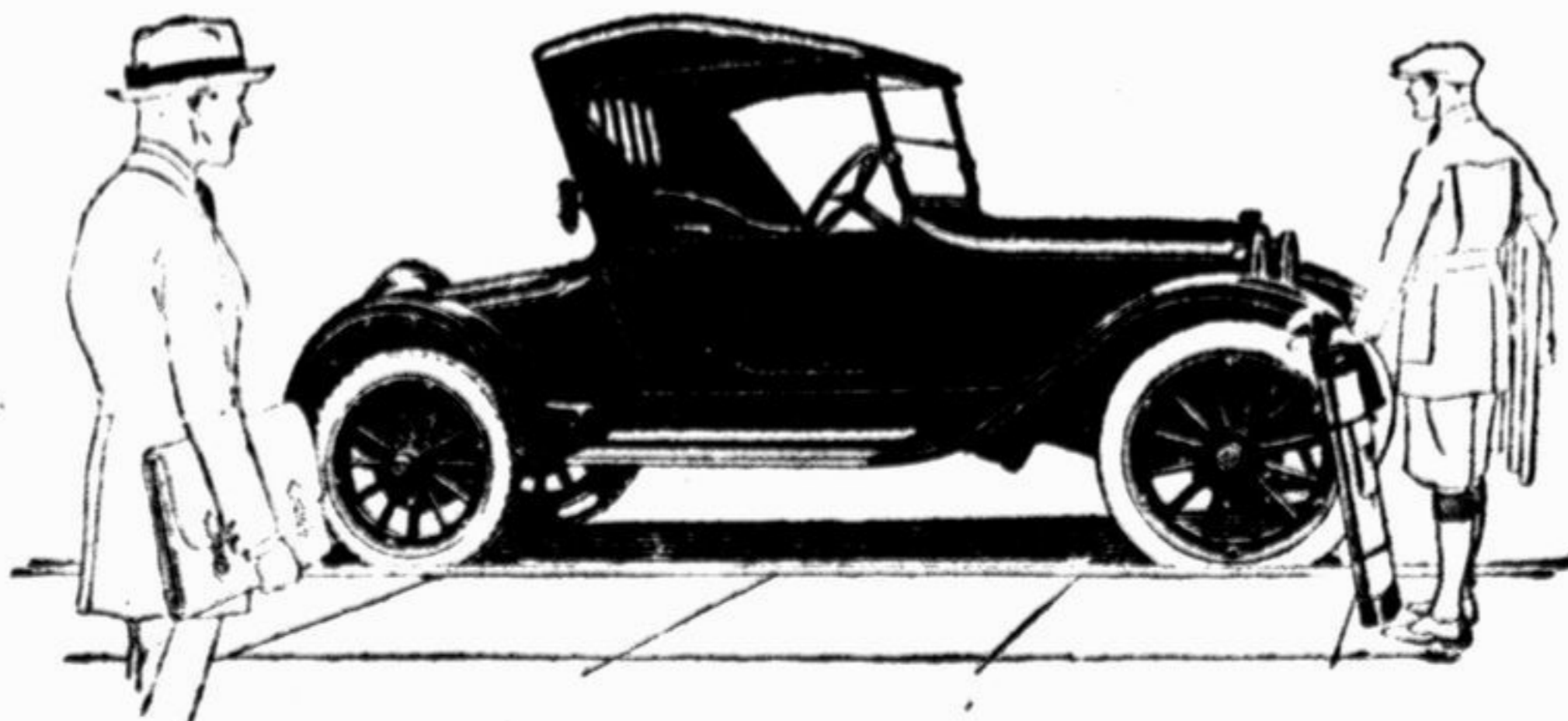
