

### NEW PICTURE FOR LECTURE ON LEPER

Interesting Illustrations at St. Joseph's Church Hall in the Near Future.

Rev. Eneas B. Goodwin, pastor of St. Joseph's Church, this week wa informed by Sir Anthony Matre, Knight of St. Gregory, that he has just received a photograph of the leper band of the colony at Molokai, Hawaii, and that a slide is being made from the picture for inclusion in the illustrated lecture on Father Damien, the apostle of the lepers, which is to be given at St. Joseph's Hall, June twenty-second.

Sir Anthony says that this band which plays on special occasions in the leper settlement, is composed wholly of lepers in varying stages of the disease. Those in advanced stages occasionally lose a part of their lip when blowing a wind instrument, while parts of fingers drop from the musicians who perform on stringed instruments.


