D. 1921, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters residing within the boundaries of said Downers Grove Sanitary District, the proposition of issuing bonds to the amount of \$75,000, for the purpose of defraying the cost of constructing a sewage disposal plant and outlet sewer, connecting the present system of sewers of the village of Downers Grove with said sewage disposal plant, and to acquire the necessary land and right of way therefor, all as is provided in and by an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled, "An Act to create sanitary districts and to provide for sewage disposal" approved June 22, 1917, in force July 1, 1917, and all Acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.
