BOARD OF REVIEW HOLDING DAILY SESSIONS

Assessment List and Real Estate Changes in a Special Edition of Reporter Next Week.

The Board of Review for the County is now having daily sessions at Wheaton and will continue their labors for some time. In the same manner that the Illinois Tax Commission equalizes the values of one county against another, thus the Board of Review equalizes the values of the nine townships in the County. Last year the Board found over a million dollars worth of assessable property in the county that the Assessors failed to list. So far this year they find the Assessors have listed 194,551 acres of land in the County, the assessed value being \$34 per acre; the average value per acre including improvements is about \$44 per acre; 22,373 head of cattle, average value \$41 per head; 6,691 horses, average value, \$82; 7,794 hogs, average \$12; 3,774 automobiles.

Addison township is the only one in the County in which the Assessor listed no grain; there are only 39 watches and clocks in Addison township; only 12 in Wayne township. This week the Reporter is printing in full the assessment of personal property and changes in the assessment of real estate for Downers Grove Township. This is the official list. Look up your assessment and if you have any complaint to make send it to the Board of Review in writing before the first day of August.

ILLINOIS HEALTH SAYS GIVE CLEAN SPORTS TO "KIDS"
Department Advocates Summer Program of Leadership for the Boys and Girls.

With the advent of warm weather it becomes necessary to guard well the source of public water supplies. The small boy is abroad seeking a swimming hole for his summer's sport. He knows a good one when he sees it, and the fact that the public water supply is drawn from the place of his selection is of secondary consideration, if any, to him. While the boy is to be complimented for his discernment, his sport, if permitted,

would not have a tendency towards the promotion of the public health. Owing to the inability of municipal authorities or private or public corporations to control the entire drainage area from which public water supplies are drawn, the greatest care is necessary during the summer months if typhoid fever is to be prevented. For this reason many communities are installing purification plants. In fact, the modern system of water supply is not complete without an adequate method of sterilization.

The needs of the small boy should also receive due consideration. The summer is his vacation time, when he responds to the commands of nature by seeking healthy recreation. In large communities his needs are met by public play grounds, none of them are complete without its swimming pool. The boy operates collectively

rather than individually, and while perhaps rebelling at the individual bath, delights in collective swimming events. When his physical needs can be satisfied in his play, the one great aim is accomplished.

Child life is the greatest asset of any community. The first duty of every community is to promote the health of its children, and the best method of accomplishing this end becomes a community problem. The Boy Scout, the Girl Scout and Boy's Brotherhood Republic movement has this end in view. Furnish the boys and girls with clean sports under clean leadership on public play grounds or on hikes to woods and streams, and the reward will be a mighty race of strong, clean men and women who will successfully grapple with all future problems of home, of church and of state.
