

# LEGION LOST TO WAUKEGAN NINE 6 TO 4 SUNDAY

Fast Lemont Nine Booked for Game Next Sunday—Team to go "On The Road"

With the old zipp lacking and playing with a weak outfit the local nine took the count before the snappy Waukegan ball club Sunday. Waukegan proved to be a real nine and kept the Legionnaires up on their toes the entire nine innings. Snappy pitching by Bert Bennett kept the visitors from doing more than a 6 to 4 defeat. The 4 run lead garnered the visitors in the second was too great for the locals to capsize. Some poor fielding was a help to victory for the North Shore boys.

**Waukegan Scores Early.** Waukegan opened up by crashing across two markers with alacrity. After Repas had whiffed, O'Farrell drew a pass and went to second on a passed ball. Silenck laid one down putting O'Farrell on third. Butch Klein then played piggy with Ehnert's fly and allowed O'Farrell to score. Lotte doubled to right center pushing Ehnert over the sack. That was all as Grass breezed past three good ones. The locals evened things up and put two counters across in their half of the first. If the old snap and poke had been present the game could have been chucked away neatly in this spasm. Mochel hopped on a fast one for a single. Nash and Ehn-inger drew a walk making the sacks drunk with none gone. Binder lofted one to right. Kingsley's single put Mochel and Nash across; Ehn-inger going to second. Klein whiffed and Charley rolled out to third. The big chance had been missed and defeat stung badly.

The Waukeganites batted around in the second frame garnering four safeties for four runs. After two were down and Hall-stein had singled, Repas drove one to right center for two sacks, Hall-stein registering. O'Farrell lifted one to Butch Klein but he fozzled it allowing Repas to go. Silenck would have been an easy out but Mochel heaved badly allowing the winning run to score. Two more singles to right field filled the sacks but Gross rolled out to Binder. In the next inning Bennett tightened and kept the Waukeganites from registering further assault, allowing but four swats in seven innings.

**Locals Fight Gamely.** The Legion gang worked hard to put runs across but that old punch was missing. In the fourth Mrkvi-cka drew a pass, went to second on a passed ball and scored on Pitcher Bennett's single. Again in the fifth the locals tried to wreck things. Nash drew a walk and advanced on Herb's single. Binder drove to deep center but a snappy catch gyped him of a single. Nash was allowed to travel to third and was doubled. Herb went to the far corner on a bum peg by Hall-stein to second. Kingsley's infield hit allowed him to score, that being the end of damaging activities for the rest of the game. Three men faced Waukegan's southpaw hurler in each inning after the fifth. The locals were badly outplayed in all parts of the game Sunday. The visitors being a bunch of real clouters and heavily ball players. Their infield was fast and snappy. Much credit must be given them and another tilt with them is a possibility.

**Lemont Next Sunday.** Next Sunday the locals will tackle the fast nine from Lemont and this may be the last game on the local lot for several Sundays. Manager Binder has found it difficult to get games because of the amount asked to play here. For the past few weeks each game has been a loser, financially. Sunday the Waukegan bunch were a good bunch of ball players and the expenses for bringing them here were large. The crowd was large and should have netted the Legion money. Instead, they lost money! Just this—either everybody coughs up with a bit and a dime or baseball is nice for a few Sundays until the boys can make up a deficit by going to another town and then come home and comp before the fans in a cratic manner.
