The next big struggle in Illinois will be on the adoption of a new Illinois Constitution. The Constitutional Convention adjourned to September 6, 1921.

There is violent opposition by the minority representation in the Convention relative to apportionment in the House of Representatives.

At each apportionment there would be an ever increasing number of the downstate counties without State representation.

Those who oppose the limitation of representation in Cook County will cry out against "disfranchising our children."

The voters of Illinois will probably have to choose at the polls which of the above plans will be incorporated into our constitution.
