along the north line of said Block 10 and Block 9 of Richmond and Whitney's Addition to the center line of Highland Ave., thence southerly along the center line of Highland to the center line of Grant Ave. in E. H. Prince & Co's. Addition; thence westerly along the center line of said Grant Ave. extended to the west line of lot 1 of the Downer Estate, being across and to the west line of property owned by Geo. F. Repp; thence southerly along the west line to the center line of said Chicago Ave.; to the center line of Fairview Ave.; thence southerly along the center line of Fairview Ave. to the place of beginning.

Also the territory which is bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

That part of Section 7, Township 38 North, Range 11 East of the Third Principal Meridian lying West of the present limits of the Village of Downers Grove, described as follows: beginning on the North line of said Section 7 at the Northwest corner of the present limits of said Village; thence west along the North line of said Section 7 to the center line of Lee Avenue as shown on plat of Branagar Brothers Wooded Homesites as recorded in the Recorder's Office of DuPage County, Illinois; thence South on the center line of said Lee Avenue extended to the South line of Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Right of Way; thence East along said right of way to the Easterly boundary line of Forest Preserve property; thence southerly along said Forest Preserve to the Northwest corner of Lot 7, Block 2, Maple Grove Addition to Downers Grove; thence Easterly along the North line of said Lot 7 to the West line of Lot 6 Block 2 Maple Grove Addition; thence South along the West line of Lot 6 Block 2 to the Southerly boundary of said Maple Grove Addition; thence Easterly along said Southerly boundary to the Southwest corner of Lot 81 of the Assessor's Subdivision of Sections 7 & 8; thence Easterly along the Southerly line of said Lot 81 to the present Western boundary of the Village of Downers Grove; thence North along said Western Boundary to the place of beginning.

Kindling the Fire. Cheap candles, cut into small bits and placed in the kindling in the kitchen stove, make an even better method of quickly starting the fire in the morning than using kerosene. And it is just as economical.

Famous Poem Founded on Fact. Mrs. Hemans' poem "Casablanca" is founded on the death of Louis Casablanca, a French naval officer. As captain of the flagship Orient, he commanded the fleet, which transported Napoleon to Egypt. In the battle of Abukir, Admiral Brucey was killed and Casablanca was put in command. He was wounded and the ship caught fire, but still he remained at his post. His 10-year-old son would not leave his father and both were killed when the ship was blown up.

Fraternity the Great Need. It was Victor Hugo who conceived this thought: "The true resistance of man against catastrophes is an augmentation of humanity. Love one another, aid one another. To Clean Window Shades. To dry clean a window shade, spread it full length on the kitchen table or on the floor and rub it thoroughly all over with dry salt and a neutral, renewing the mixture as it becomes soiled. Then dust well with a soft duster. The shade need not be removed from the roller and this method does not pull it out of shape or cause it to crack.

To Brighten Carpets. Brighten your carpets after the dust has been beaten out of them by scattering on them cornmeal mixed with salt, and then sweeping them off. Spots can be removed by the use of ox-gall or ammonia and water.

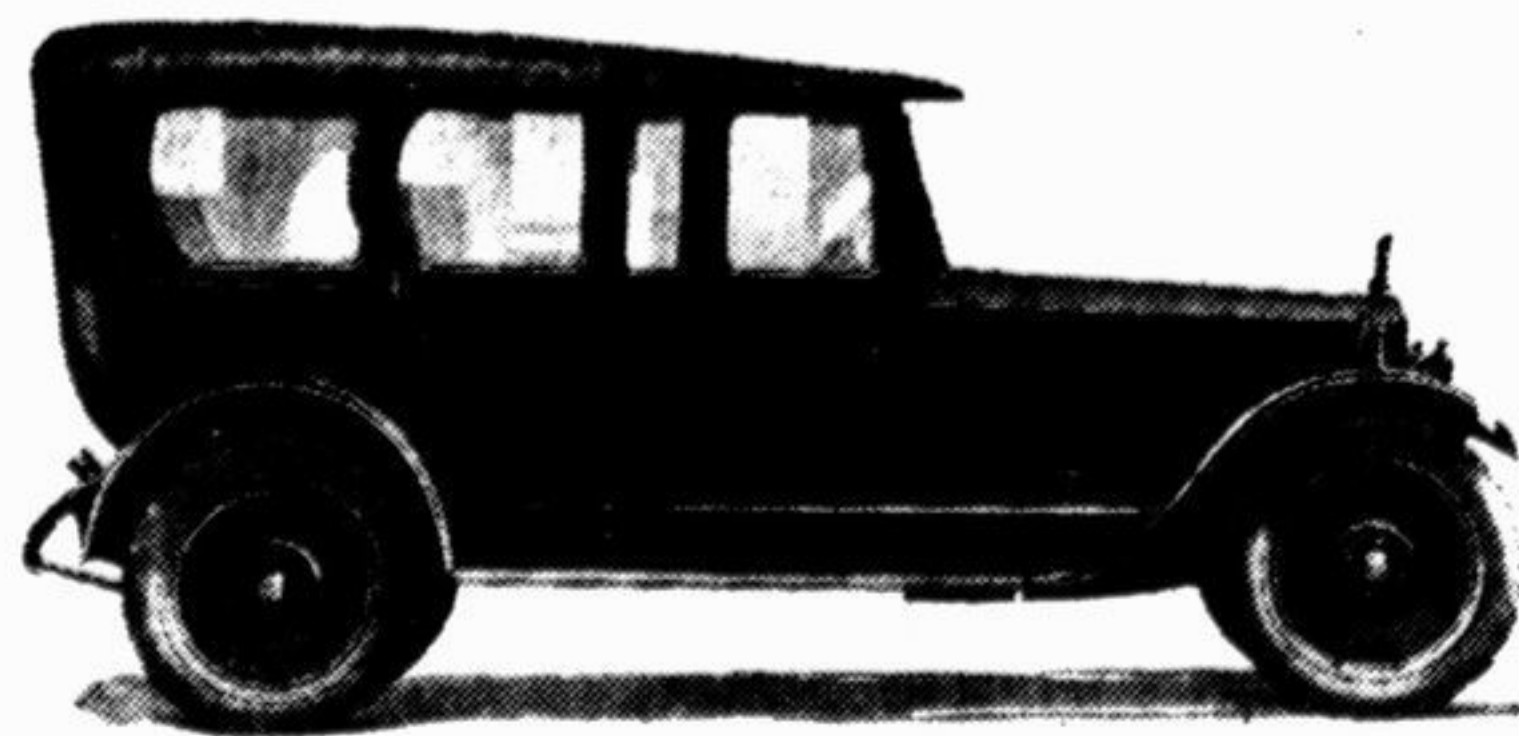
