BOARD PUBLISHES NEW LAW IN REGARD TO SCHOOLS

Such propositions may be submitted at any time, and from time to time, to the voters of such district, village or city, at any such election and such directors or board of education shall levy or cause to be levied no tax in excess of two per cent for educational purposes, or in excess of three-quarters of one per cent for building purposes and purchase of school grounds, that shall not be authorized by the result of such election ascertained as aforesaid, unless and until assented to by the voters of such district, village or city in like manner.

The Board of Education of District No. 58 at its last regular meeting unanimously adopted a resolution deciding to present to the voters of said district the proposition for their assent.

Many of the districts of Illinois have accepted the provisions of this new law and it is hoped that the voters of School District No. 58 will do likewise.
