Prospects of Coming Year Throw Zip Pep and Snap into Athletic Rah-Rahs of D. G. H. S.

Another year has sublimely glided away in the history of Downers Grove High School Athletics and another far more joyous and successful one is to slip into place. The droziness and melancholy of the summer season is soon to flit into the realms of reminiscences and the joys and enthusiasm of athletics is to replace the stagnant and slow moving activities of the vacation. With the ushering in of this years football season Downers Grove is again on the verge of seeing the "Purple and White" thronged and overwhelmed with the feeling of victory and perfect harmony.

A close perusal of last years stock and those who will return to the four year halls of learning moves to proclaim this a banner year for the Purple. Among the things making for good teams and real success are the qualities and aspirations of a coach. In "Tommy" Rogers the high school is overly blessed with a real man, a real coach and a real co-operator. "Tommy" comes here next week to start his second year as teacher and director of athletics in the local high school. His success last year was not measured by victories but by spirit aroused and the apparent keenness for his association. "Tommy" was the famed athlete of Knox College. He knows the fine points of every major sport and has let his knowledge sink deep into the heads of his adept pupils. He is much enthused to get to work this year and says he expects big things to happen this year. He has looked forward to this fall with much concern and is already planning his motives for the year.

The "Purple" has many athletes and regulars to draw from this year. But three of last years eleven have left the seat of knowledge. "Bullet" Tank, "Sullie" Sullivan and "Art" Tylor have journeyed forth leaving the fullback, quarterback and a guard position open. Capt. "Foy" Phelps will again pilot the "Purple" with no small amount of pep and zeal. "Foy" will no doubt be finding holes

and making gains from the fullback position this year. Coach Rogers has his veterans of last year back for the halfback jobs in "Bud" Smith and "Don" Stevenson. One of the backfield artists will be easily groomed for the pilot position. The line this year should be fast and heavier than last years, besides the possession of a wealth of experience. Russ Stevens will be back to take his place at end again. Russ is a real old-timer at the end place and has learned much from Coach Rogers. The tackle jobs will in all probability be handled by "Clown" Grumhaus, "Huck" Rogers and "Cliff" Sedgwick. These boys are bulky and sure play a keen and cruel game in the line. "Kelly" has been farming to work off surplus food and expects to be a real bulwark at one of the guard jobs. The "Big Red Head" known as "Tutti" Brooks, is all primed to handle the center job. This boy is quite some there and has three more years to work on the Purple squad. There are some promising Frosh coming in, among whom Trakas looks good. Being a rangy lad and possessing close to 170 pounds avoirdupois, he should be a find for Coach Rogers. The team should be a winner this year with the old timers together and "Tommy" up and pushing again.

No definite schedule has been made so far but it is assured that Naperville, Hinsdale, Wheaton and Glen Ellyn will be tussled with.

Basket Ball Prospects
"Russ" Stephens will pilot the 1921-22 basketball squad of Downers Grove High School. "Russ" was a real asset to the team last year at a guard position. He is built stockily and possesses rare judgment on the floor. He is expected to bring up good this year and aid in bringing many victories to the Purple. Art Tylor captained the team last year and was the only one to graduate, his loss will be felt badly. The forward positions will be handled by Stephenson, Putnam and Phelps again this year. Phelps is also a corking center and may be placed there. At the guard positions Capt. Stephens and Bud Smith should show good form. A good crop of "Scrubs" and Frosh should swell the number of candidates and make competition for places quite keen.

After reviewing this large mass of snappy and promising material we can see no reason for a poor season this coming year. Experience and

good coaching are essentials and things look promising but should we predict wrong, we chance to say that at least this year will be a pep restorer in the high school. It is the followers that makes the game and it is the earnest desire of all interested in the high school life that enthusiasm be spread and each and every lover of Downers Grove boost and back the Purple and White teams in victory and more so in defeat, when the tide is going the wrong way and youth is prone to lie down and disgustingly quit.

Steps are being taken to promote gymnastics and other forms of athletics for those who are not directly participants on the "varsity" squad. Practice in football starts on Monday, September 12th.
