Analysis by the State Water Survey Division Shows City Supply is Very Pure.

A report of the State Water Supply Division shows Downers Grove city water to be pure and rich in mineral constituents. Following is part of the report of the chemist who examined a sample of water taken from the deep well on February 22, 1921.
