Army since 1910, William and Charles, of Downers Grove, and Albert, of Glen Ellyn, and three daughters, Cecelia, of the Grove and Mrs. Mary Malecke and Mrs. Rose Armstrong, of Chicago, besides a host of other relatives and friends.
