

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD

Downers Grove, Ill. Sept. 19th, 1921.

Regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, Illinois. Present at roll call Mayor W. C. Barber and Commissioners Bender, Bryce, Haller and Heardt.

Minutes of the meeting of September 12th, 1921, were read and Commissioner Bender moved to approve same. On roll call Commissioners Bender, Bryce, Haller, Heardt and Mayor Barber voted Aye. Nays none. Motion carried.

A canvas was made of the Tally Sheets and Poll Books of the Municipal Election held in Downers Grove, Illinois, on September 17th, 1921, for the purpose of voting on the questions: "Shall a certain tract of land, known as Branagar Brothers Wooded Homesites, and certain territory lying North and East of the present Village Limits, be annexed to the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage, State of Illinois," which showed the following vote cast:

Branagar Brothers Wooded Homesites, For the proposition.....153 votes Against.....27 votes Territory Lying North and East of Present Village Limits, For the proposition.....169 votes Against.....21 votes

We, the undersigned canvassing board, do hereby certify that we have canvassed the returns made to the Village Clerk of the Municipal Election held in the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage, State of Illinois, on the 17th day of September, 1921, and that the foregoing is a true and correct statement of the number of votes cast for and against the propositions.

An Ordinance for the Annexation of Certain Territory to the Village of Downers Grove. Whereas, it appears to the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage and State of Illinois, that heretofore a petition was presented to it for the annexation of certain contiguous territory, the external boundaries of which are as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the southeast corner of Section 8, Township 38 North, Range 11 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois; and running thence easterly on the South line of Section 9, Township and Range aforesaid, to the North and South center line of Section 9; thence northerly along said North and South center line of Section 9, to the North line of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company right of way; thence westerly along said North line of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company right of way, to the east line of the west half of the west half of said Section 9; thence northerly along said east line to the north line of said Section 9; thence continuing north to the north line of Otis Avenue in East Grove Syndicate Subdivision; thence westerly along the north line of said Otis Avenue to the center line of Fairview Avenue; thence northerly along the center line of Fairview Avenue, to the center line of Summit Avenue and thence continuing westerly along the center line of Grant Avenue to the north line of Block 19 in Richmond & Whitney's Addition; thence westerly along the north line of Highland Avenue; thence southerly along the center line of Highland Avenue to the center line of Grant Avenue in E. H. Prince & Co.'s Addition; thence westerly along the center line of said Grant Avenue extended to the west of Lot 1 of the Downer Estate, being across and to the west line of property owned by George Repp; thence southerly along the west line to the center of said Chicago Avenue; to the center line of Fairview Avenue; hence southerly along the center line of Fairview Avenue to the place of beginning. (This territory lies North and East of the present Village limits)

(which said territory is accurately described in the map hereto attached, and made a part of this ordinance): And Whereas, it further appears that the question of said annexation was submitted to the legal voters of said Village at a general election held in and for said Village, on the 17th day of September, A. D. 1921, and that a majority of all the votes cast at said election were in favor of said annexation, and that said petition and the election held in pursuance thereof were in all respects in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided, Therefore,

Be It Ordained by the Council of said Village of Downers Grove: Section 1. That the territory herein described be and hereby is annexed

to the Village of Downers Grove, in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois;

Section 2. That the Mayor of said Village of Downers Grove, be and he is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this ordinance in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the said County of DuPage, as directed in and by an act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled "An Act to provide for annexing and excluding territory to and from cities, towns and villages, and to unite cities, towns and villages," approved April 10th, 1872, and in force July 1st, 1872, and all acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, as provided by law.

How to use and care For your Gas Range

To make its operation most effective and its life of service long.

The upper oven in your gas range is for baking and roasting; the lower oven is for broiling. The same burners heat both ovens—you can bake and broil at the same time with the same consumption of gas.

After use, the oven doors should be left partly open to permit free circulation of air while the oven is cooling. This will prevent your oven from rusting. A little oil or grease in which there is no salt) applied with a brush or piece of soft cloth, will also prevent rust.

You can greatly prolong the usefulness of your gas range by keeping all parts clean of dust and grease and by going over them with a cloth and stove oil.

You need not remove the oven burners to clean them. You can go over them occasionally with a stiff brush. And if the holes to the air mixer or oven burners become clogged with dust or grease, clean them with a piece of wire.
