In the Simplon tumel under the Alps, which is by for the greatest funnel in the world, the quantity of water flowing out of the southern end, from the many veins encountered in the heart of the mountain, amounted to 15,000 gallons a minute, and furpished sufficient power to compress the air by which the drifts were worked, and to refrigerate the tunnel. The necessity for retrigeration may be judged from the fact that the heat as high as 150 degrees Fahrenbeit when not artificially reduced.


