Tom Hawkyard was born on December 8, 1848 in Yorkshire, England, he came to Ontario, Canada in 1869 and was married to Miss Fannie Kent on April 2, 1872.

Mr. Hawkyard located in Downers Grove in 1884 where he raised his family and educated them. He was well known to the older residents of the village and will be remembered by them.

In infancy he was baptized in the faith of the Church of England and has been a faithful follower since.

Mr. Hawkyard was made a Master Mason in Seymour Lodge, No. 27, Ontario, Canada, in the year 1872 and for nearly fifty years worked with the brethren wherever he made his home.

GOODMAN, AUTO INVESTIGATOR, VISITS DOWNERS

Improvements in Conditions Regarding Auto Laws Here Since Last Time.

Mr. Goodman, Automobile Investigator for Secretary of State Louis L. Zimmerman, is making another round-up of violators of the automobile law in Downers Grove, and vicinity.

"The law giving inspectors appointed by the Secretary of State police powers in enforcing the automobile laws," Mr. Goodman said, "went into force July 1st and already many thousands of dollars more than the cost of these inspectors has been brought into the good roads fund through this means."

"In localities visited the number of applications for chauffeur's licenses has been increased practically 100 per cent and many delinquents have secured license plates."

"The first visit of inspectors to a community is largely for the purpose of warning delinquents, but we feel that sufficient warning has now been given and the law will be strictly enforced and delinquents punished under the penalties provided."
