The day was interesting and instructive as such occasions are bound to be when women interested in such a broad field of endeavor as the present day enlightened club women meet. One of the most important and interesting subjects brought before the women was that by Mrs. Topping of Elgin, of the arrival in this country of the ninety year old Japanese woman whom she had recently met, who has come to this country bringing a statement signed by ten thousand Japanese women pledging their friendship and a hope for better understanding between the people of the United States and Japan. The ten thousand names were secured within one week she told Mrs. Topping and was intended to assist in some measure to counteract the activities of the war making elements in both the United States and Japan, who by their use of the public press do so much to bring about misunderstandings and war between nations. The women seemed to grasp the great import of this message from Mrs. Topping.

The Board was invited to hold its next meeting in Anrona as the guests of the Anrona Woman's Club. The members of the Joliet Club were most courteous and attentive to the visiting guests and added greatly to the pleasure of the occasion.
