

**NAPER H. S. LOST TO D. G. H. S. ON SNOWY GRIDIRON**

Locals and Wheaton Now the Only Undefeated High School Teams in DuPage County.

Downers Grove High School football team put Naperville out of the running for county champs last Saturday when they were victors in a 20 to 0 contest on a slippery and snow covered field. Both teams were unbeaten until Saturday. This is the first victory over a Naperville eleven in five years and the second in nine years. The Purple outplayed their opponents in every branch of the game and showed that they will be no easy match for the Wheaton champs. The aerial attack was responsible for the three touchdowns registered by the Purple. Naperville was relying on the passing game but could not make yards as the Downers Secondary defense broke them up repeatedly and turned two of the intercepted passes into touchdowns.

Score on Pass to Baron. The first score of the game came in the closing minutes of the first quarter. Naperville kicked to Baron who brought it back to Naperville's forty yard line. The wet field made going slow and the locals were forced to kick. Naperville found the local line impregnable and kicked. After losing the ball on downs several times, Naperville kicked to the local forty yard line from where Boone carried it to the thirty yard line. Don Stephenson passed neatly to Baron who went the rest of the way for a score. Don failed to kick goal. Naperville braced for a while but couldn't stop the fast drives of Phelps and Rogers. Time and time again the local worked the ball down the field on complicated shift plays, straight line backs and forward passes. Naperville's heavy line held and the locals were unable to put a score across. With but a few seconds to play and the ball in Naperville's possession on the five yard line Williams attempted a long pass. Don Stephenson made a mad leap and rushed thirty yards for a touchdown as the whistle blew. Don kicked goal. Score first half, D. G. H. S. 13; N. H. S. 0.

Both teams showed improvement in the third quarter with Naperville outplaying the Purple. At no time was the Purple's goal in danger altho the play in the third quarter was in Downers territory most of the time. Naperville attempted numerous forward passes in this quarter but could not make yards on them despite the fact that they completed a good share of them. The tackling of the locals was extremely hard and the Naperville lads were thrown for large losses when Russ Stephens and Harry Putnam broke thru. Williams of Naperville shown the best for the visitors in this half but was nailed in his tracks repeatedly when the local tackles broke thru the line with apparent ease. Several exchanges of punts in the third quarter failed to give either side any marked advantage. Naperville was only able to make gains on a short pass to the backfield from a fake punt or pass formation. The quarter ended with the play well in the local territory.

Score in Closing Minutes. As the quarter opened the locals seemed to brace and gained almost all with using queer shifts and end around plays which completely baffled the visitors. Drives off tackle and around the ends by Don, "Huck" Rogers and Barron put the ball on Naperville's ten yard line. Four attempts thru the line failed and Naperville punted to Billy Boone on their forty yard line and he ran it back to the ten yard line. Again thru a variety of shifts and line backs the Purple was held down for downs. Naperville kicked to Boone who brot it back ten yards. Little headway was made and Don Stephenson attempted to kick from the twenty yard line but it went wild. Naperville again resorted to the pass. Russ Stevens intercepted one of the longer ones in the same place that Don had before and tore for the final score of the game. Don Stephenson kicked goal.

Final score D.G.H.S. 20 N.H.S. 0. Coach Rogers has shown that he can make a team out of the Purple warriors and much credit for the victories goes to his creditable work during the week. In Russ and Putty the Purple has a pair ends that can be relied upon to handle the flanks in good order. Both showed up well Saturday. The center of the line was weak at times but only lacks experience. In the backfield Billy Boone handles the pilots job in good style altho slow in getting away. Capt. Foy Phelps at a tackle's job does splendid work and when drawn back to the full backs position, is a human ram rod. "Huck" Rogers showed up in stellar form at the full station. His partners are fast and can drive off tackle in good style. Baron on the right and Don on the left form a fast combination.

The locals are now tied for the DuPage county championship with Wheaton, not having been defeated this year.
