HAYS, POSTMASTER GENERAL, IN MESSAGE TO CHILDREN

Asks Their Cooperation During the Annual Christmas Work of The Department.

Postmaster General Will H. Hays, has addressed a lengthy Christmas message to the school children of the United States the gist of which is to mail all Christmas parcels early, wrap them securely and address them legibly.

It is a fact that the late mailing of packages, greeting cards, and what not, every year, throws a great deal of unnecessary work on the postoffice department.

In his message Will Hays says, "The address on every letter, card or package must be correct, complete and legible, including the house number and name of street, and the 'From' address should be in the upper left hand corner so that the mail will be returned to you in case it is not delivered."

Downers Grove people can greatly help the local postoffice and incidently the whole system, if they will just remember three points: Mail EARLY; Wrap SECURELY; and Address LEGIBLY but the most important of these is MAIL YOUR CHRISTMAS PARCELS THIS WEEK.

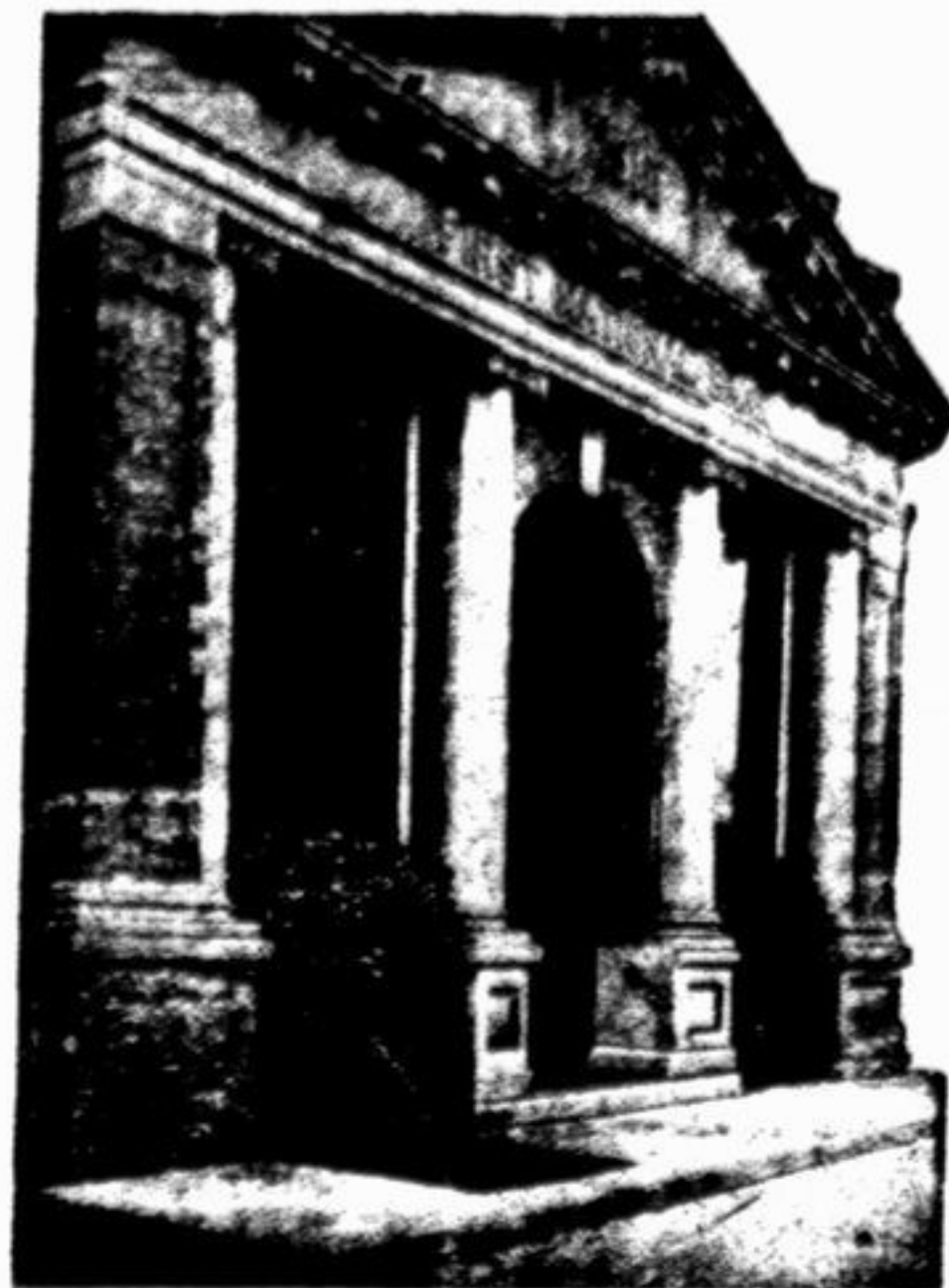
