

NEWS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION

The first regular meeting of the New Year of Alexander Bradley Burns Post, American Legion, will be held Monday evening, January 9, at the Legion rooms. At this meeting plans will be adopted for a membership drive. A good attendance is desired.

Both eyes destroyed by American shells during the world war, Franz Riedel, who served the Kaiser, now is kept from suffering by an American organization descended out of "Perseus." Someone bought the clothing at a summertime sale held by the American Legion post of Maspeth, Long Island, and sent it to a woman acquaintance in Germany. She passed it to the nearby German soldier. "Now I can use the little pension the Government gives me for food and need not go hungry," the former eyeless soldier says in a letter of thanks to the Legion post. Ex-Soldaten Riedel lives in Ekeren, Germany.

American soldiers and marines who won the coveted Congressional Medal of Honor during the war will receive the Italian war cross; officials of the American Legion have been informed by the Italian embassy. Gen. Van Caren, chief of staff of the embassy, already has begun distribution of the medal. Steps have been taken by the Legion to also obtain the cross for naval men who received the Congressional medal.

Members of the American Legion all over the country hereafter will be kept informed of what Congress and the government are doing for ex-service men through a weekly bulletin issued by the Legion's legislative committee. The bulletin will be sent to all Legion newspapers and publications and state officials.

Marriage after the entrance of America into the world war did not constitute an attempted evasion of the draft so as to deprive the service man of a home claim under the Minnesota statute. The Minnesota supreme court has ruled.

Parents of wives of Americans who died overseas during the world war and whose bodies have not been returned would have an opportunity to visit the graves of their deceased if government legislation in a resolution introduced into Congress by Rep. Hamilton E. Felt, New York, a member of the American Legion. The resolution directs the secretary of War to provide for payment to the American cemetery commission.

A request that Congress make an amendment to the existing Butcher Act to cover the states of California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin that the American Legion, which is concerned in Negro relief, could not find no place in the act to cover the states of California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin.

Miner's Cradle.

The cradle is a simple appliance for treating "pay dirt" earth and gravel containing gold dust. It consists essentially of box mounted on rockers, and provided with a perforated bottom of sheet iron in which the "pay dirt" is placed. Water is poured on the dirt, and the rocking motion imparted to the cradle causes the finer particles to pass through the perforated bottom on to a canvas screen and thence to the base of the cradle, where the gold dust accumulates on transverse bars of wood called "rifles."
