EDWIN HEARTT

Edwin Heartt, one of the boys who went from Cass into the service of our country during the Civil War died at his home in Chicago, Saturday, December 24. He was wellknown to the older citizens of Downers Grove Township having been born and raised in Cass, where he lived until he enlisted in the 17th Illinois Cavalry early in 1863.

Soon after his return from the war in December, 1865, he went to Chicago, where he became an honored dealer in hardware and builders supplies. For about sixty years he was a member of the Methodist-Episcopal Church, often serving in an official capacity. He was a 32d De-Mason, a Patriarch and High in the Odd Fellows, as well an honored member of the G. A.

The funeral services were held at home, 5563 Kimbark avenue, Tuesday, December 27, at 2 p. m. The G. A. R. held its ritual service was followed by a short adprayer and Scripture reading by the Rev. 
