NORTH SCHOOL TO GIVE ART EXHIBIT WED. JANUARY 18

Educational Opportunity with a Permanent Influence—Movies Also to Be Shown.

The pupils of the North Side School have a program, an art exhibit of unusual merit and a moving picture show to which they are inviting you, their fathers, mothers and friends on the evening of Jan. 19. They want you to be present at their program of music and drills, see one of the most beautiful and extensive art exhibits brought to Downers Grove, and look at a series of moving pictures which is a part of the year's list of films being used throughout our city schools this year, both public and parochial.

The purpose of the evening's program is to make it possible for our schools to own a few of these pictures to hang on the walls of rooms and corridors of our North Side school.

The Elton Art Exhibit consists of 200 large, mounted photogravures and colored prints, suitable for home and school decorations. These will be arranged on the walls and corridors of several of the school rooms. We want you to just walk about and

enjoy them before and after the program by the children and the motion picture show.

The exhibit will be with us for two days, giving all grade children an opportunity to see them. On the evening of the 19th the school will be open at 7 o'clock. Come early. We are looking for you.

To make the work of our first and second grades more efficient and to provide work suitable for the present

In the afternoon all groups will be in charge of their present teachers in their present quarters.

Why "Station to Station" Long-Distance Calls Cost You Less

You can save about twenty per cent on your toll bills by using our "Station to Station" long-distance service. To complete a call for a telephone number or for a listed telephone rather than for a particular person requires less time and avoids holding the line at the distant point while search is made for the person wanted.

Here are some sample forms for putting in "Station to Station" calls.

Signal the operator in the usual way and ask her for long distance. When the long-distance operator answers say:

"Give me St. Louis; Main 1234. Will talk to anyone."
"Give me Milwaukee, Wis.; Smith, Brown & Company. Will talk to anyone."
"Give me Louisville, Ky.; James Robinson's residence, 648 Mulberry St. Will talk to anyone."

In a very great majority of cases it is found that a call made in this way either reaches the particular person wanted or the person who answers can take the message or handle the business.
