REVENUE MEN HAVE INCOME **BLANKS FOR '22**

The forms for the filing of individual income tax returns (Form1040-A) are in the hands of the Internal Rev_ enue Collectors and work on the filing can be begun at once. E. T Weeks, chief of the eighth division, in which Downers Grove is located. is anxious that no delay be had in this work and advises that his deputies are ready to assist the tax-payers in the auditing and filling out of the return. All the taxpayers living in the district are asked to file thru the office in the Post Office Building, Aurora, either by mail or in person.

There is a penalty of 25 per centum of the total tax for failure to file within the time prescribed by Law, interesting session. and an additional penalty of 5 per centum for failure to pay the tax. To HAPPY DAYS AT WINTER SCOUT this is added 1 per centum interest for the period remaining unpaid. The necessity of prompt action on the part of the taxpayers is evident on account of the great number in the district who must file and all returns must be filed on or before March 15

Each taxpayer who filed an income tax return for 1920 wil receive a blank return by mail. It may not be received at once but it will be sent. It is desired that this form be used when possible as it carries a file number which will expedite the work of the auditors in checking.

Those required to file returns are: Every single individual, or married, not living with husband or wife, whose net income is \$1,000 or over: every married individual (living with husband or wife) whose net income is \$2,000 or more; every individual whose gross income amounted to \$5,000 or more.
