

REVENUE MEN HAVE INCOME BLANKS FOR '22

Residents of Community Asked to File Returns at the District Headquarters, Aurora

The forms for the filing of individual income tax returns (Form 1040-A) are in the hands of the Internal Revenue Collectors and work on the filing can be begun at once.

There is a penalty of 25 per centum of the total tax for failure to file within the time prescribed by Law, and an additional penalty of 5 per centum for failure to pay the tax.

Each taxpayer who filed an income tax return for 1920 will receive a blank return by mail. It may not be received at once but it will be sent.

Those required to file returns are: Every single individual, or married, not living with husband or wife, whose net income is \$1,000 or over;
