

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD

Downers Grove, Ill., Jan. 28, 1922

Regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, Ill. Present at roll call Commissioners Bender, Bryce and Heardt. Commissioner Heardt took the chair in the absence of Mayor Barber.

Minutes of the meeting of January 16th, 1922, were read and Commissioner Bender moved to approve same. On roll call Commissioners Bender, Bryce and Acting Mayor Heardt voted Aye. Nays none. Motion carried. Commissioner Bryce presented the following ordinance and moved for its passage:

An Ordinance Granting to the Downers Grove Sanitary District an Easement and Right of Way Over and Across Certain Property Belonging in the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage and State of Illinois.

WHEREAS, the Downers Grove Sanitary District, a municipal corporation, existing under and by the virtue of the laws of the State of Illinois, is authorized to construct a connecting sewer and sewage treating and disposal plant and the purpose of providing to the said Downers Grove Sanitary District an outlet sewer and sewage disposal;

AND WHEREAS, for the purpose of connecting the present sewer system of the Village of Downers Grove with the outlet sewer and sewage disposal plant about to be constructed by the Downers Grove Sanitary District, it became necessary to construct an outlet sewer in an across certain property belonging to the said Village of Downers Grove said outlet sewer to be 24 inches in internal diameter;

AND WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient and advisable by the Council of the said Village of Downers Grove that the easement and right of way should be granted;

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, County of DuPage and State of Illinois:

SECTION 1. That an easement and right of way be and hereby is given and granted to the said Downers Grove Sanitary District for the purpose of constructing, repairing and maintaining an outlet and connecting sewer in and across certain lands of the said Village of Downers Grove, which said right of way property is more fully described as follows, to-wit:

A strip of land twelve (12) feet wide, being six (6) feet each side of a center line described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at point 101.6 feet south of the center of Section Seven, Township 38, North, Range 11, East of the Third Principal Meridian, in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois, for a place of beginning thence north 66 degrees 51 minutes 25.15 feet to the center of sewer manhole on the center line of Gilbert Avenue extended which manhole is 250 feet west of the east line of said village property.

SECTION 2. That the said Downers Grove Sanitary District and its duly authorized agents be and hereby are granted full right and authority at any and all reasonable time to enter upon said lands, to construct, maintain and keep in repair the said sewer, doing thereby no greater damage to the lands herein described, and adjoining than is necessary, with full right of ingress and egress to and from said work across the adjoining lands of the said Village of Downers Grove. Digging of the trenches for said sewers and the refilling and maintaining of the same shall be done in all respects to the satisfaction of the Village of Downers Grove, or its duly authorized representatives.

SECTION 3. That said easement and right of way be and is hereby given to the said Downers Grove Sanitary District, in consideration of the right of the said Village of Downers Grove to connect with said sanitary and storm water sewers so to be constructed, subject however to all the reasonable rules and regulations prescribed by said Downers Grove Sanitary District concerning the connection and use of said sewers, and that said easement, right of way and privilege by this Ordinance given and granted is so given and granted, upon the express condition that if the easement herein described shall at any time cease to be used for the purpose herein expressed, then and in that event, the easement, right of way and privilege hereby granted shall cease and determine.

SECTION 4. The acceptance of this Ordinance by the Downers Grove Sanitary District being noted herein, therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

An Ordinance Fixing the Names of Certain Streets in the Village of Downers Grove, DuPage County, Illinois.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Village of Downers Grove, DuPage County, Illinois.

SECTION 1. That the names of various streets, avenues and roadways in that part of the Village of Downers Grove, DuPage County, Illinois, lying west of Washington Street and North of the South line of Chicago Avenue, be and the same are hereby named as shown on the plot hereto next attached, which plot is marked "Exhibit A" and made a part of this ordinance by reference.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

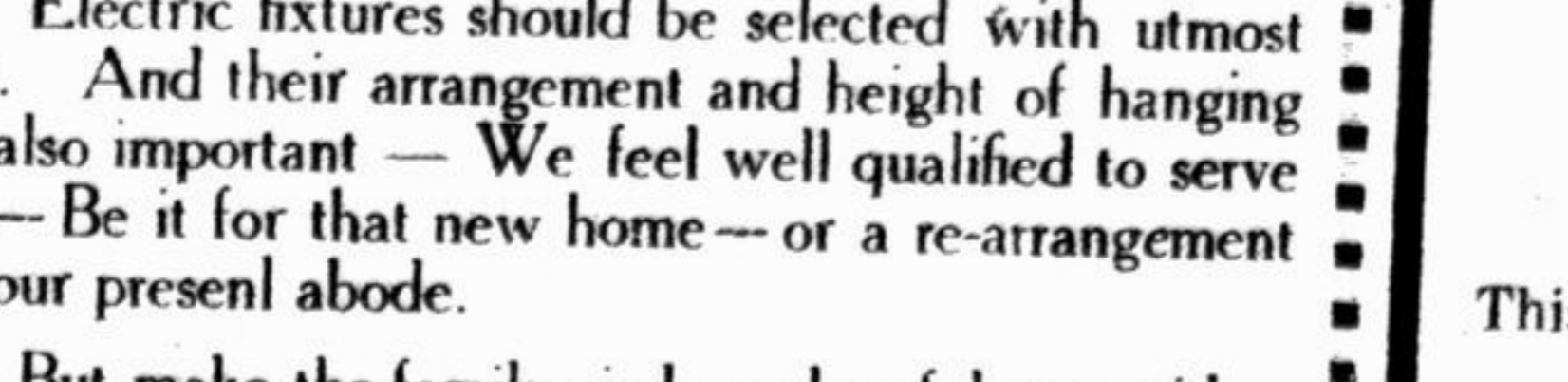
