Coming as it does on the heels of the Limitation of Armaments Conference, the impact of this movement upon the Orient and also upon the world as a whole, can be expected to bring forth results of wide spreading consequences in the Christianization of the world.

Gordon Vial who has been employed by H. Vial for the past few months, has taken a position at Hinsdale.

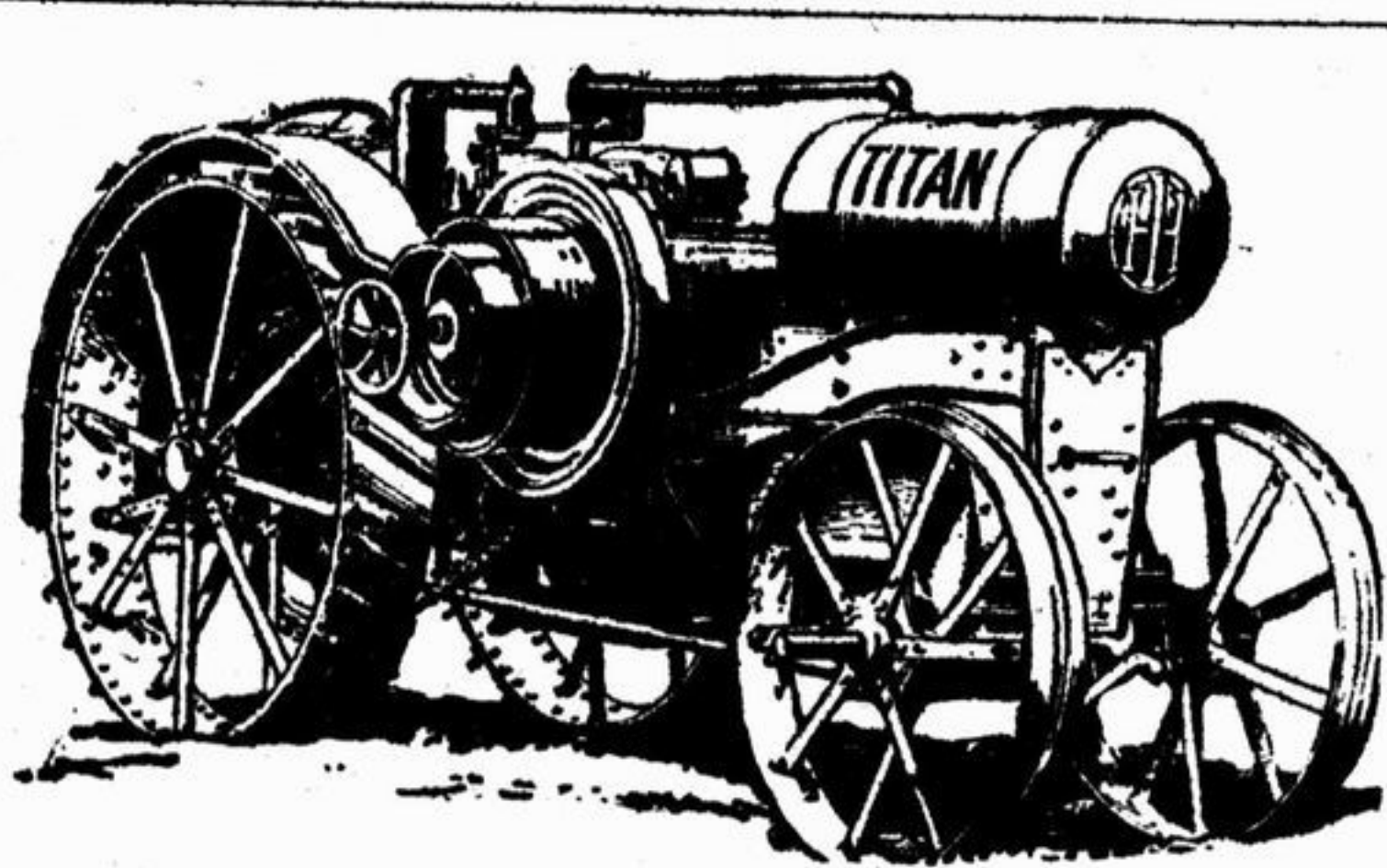

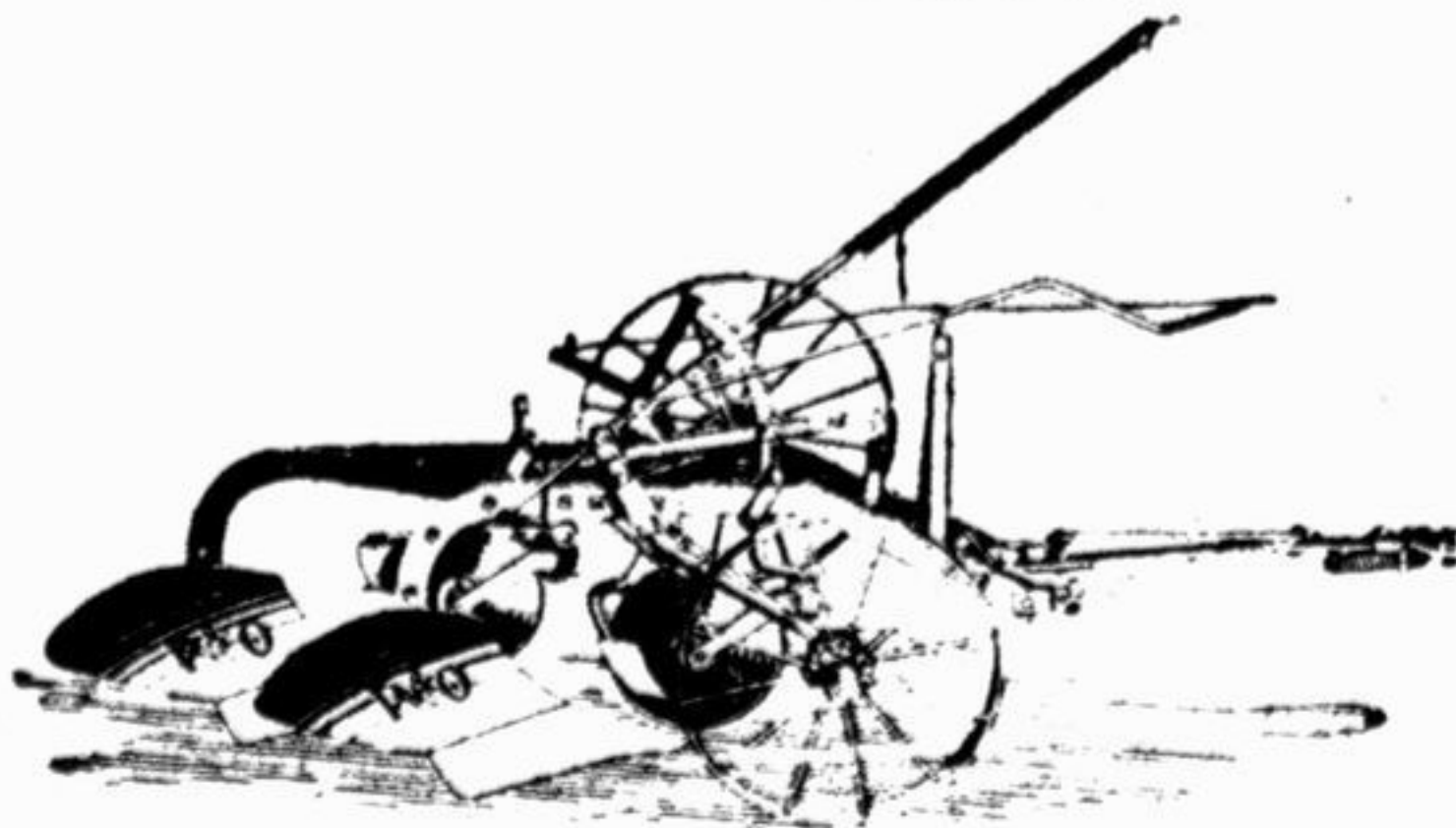

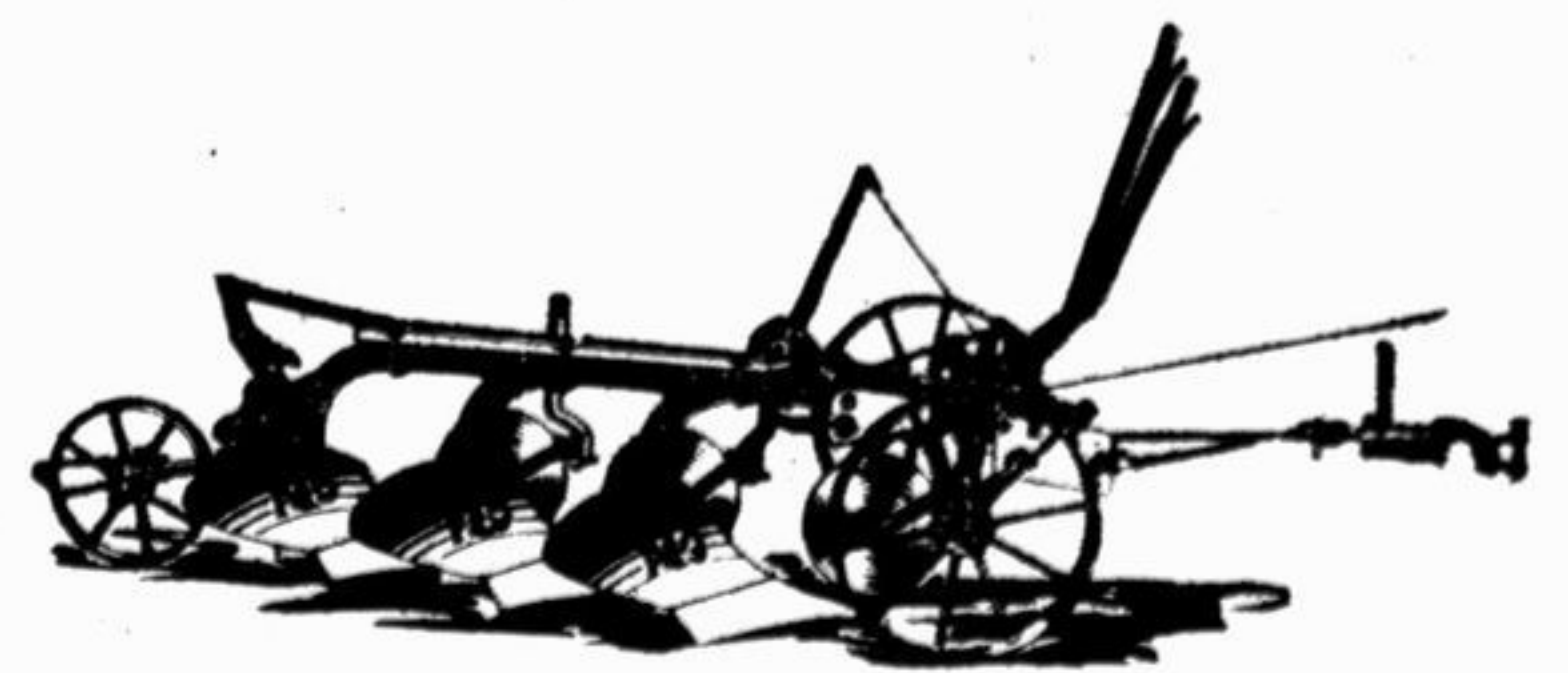
