#### DESIGNATES BIRD AND ARBOR DAYS

April 14 and October 27 Set Aside preservation of our native birds." for Annual Observation by Proclamation.

Governor Len Small today issued the following proclamation for the observance of Arbor and Bird days on April 14 and October 27.

"The laws of Illinois provide that the Governor shall, annually, in the Spring, designate a day or days to be known as "ARBOR AND BIRD


