#### LEST YOU FORGET REFERENCE BOOKS FOR THE SCHOOLS

Only Half of Three Hundred Dollar Minimum Sum Needed Has Been Subscribed.

To date, the popular fund which is being raised for the benefit of the reference library of Downers Grove high school is in the neighborhood of \$150—just half of the sum decided upon in the meeting of the Parent-Teacher association, when the question was brought up for consideration. Three hundred dollars, it was decided, was the lowest possible sum with which to replenish the shelves of the reference library, which Downers Grove high school must have if it is to maintain its standing on the accredited list of schools. This is a vital question, and must be attended to without delay.

The sum needed could be raised without working a hardship to anyone, if each family in Downers Grove would contribute one dollar to this fund. The Board of Education, already at its wits end to find money with which to finance the schools, has not a penny to spend on library books, so it is up to the patrons of the school to supply the need. If you can't give a dollar, give what you can. Send it either to your child's teacher, or to E. J. Matson of Middaugh avenue, and then rest comfortably in the consciousness of having performed a good deed.

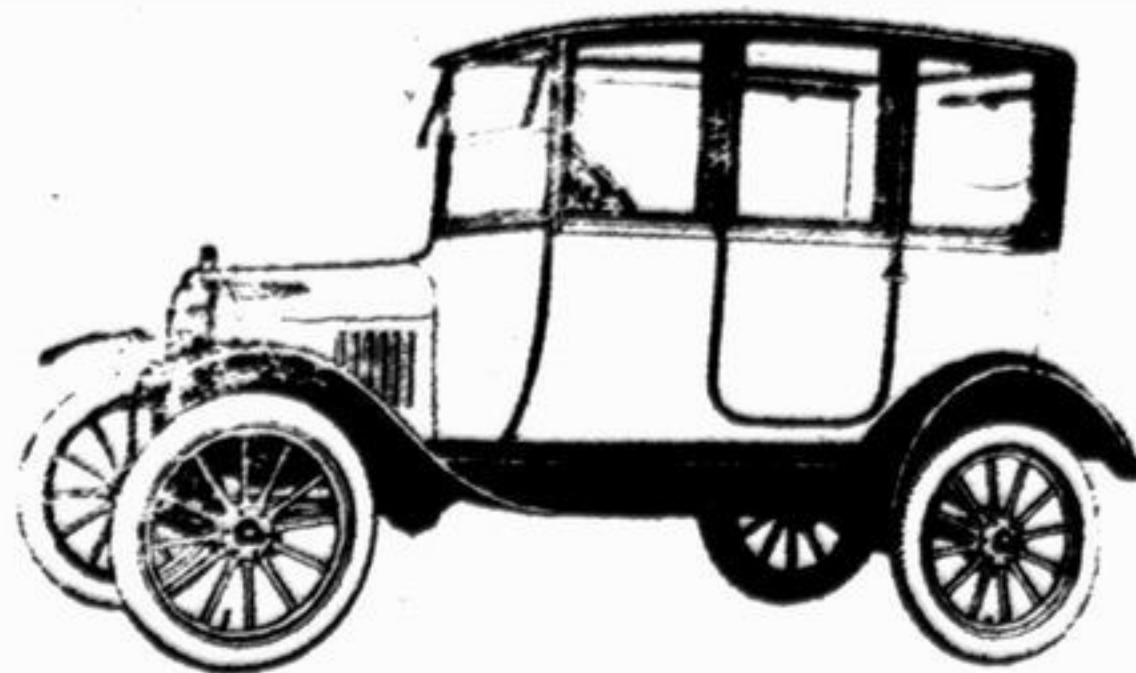
