WHY HESTERMAN FOR SHERIFF

John F. Hesterman, of Glen Ellyn, is the logical candidate for sheriff of DuPage county for several reasons. One might cite the fact that he has made an excellent reputation in public office or that he is the caliber of man who would make a good sheriff or that his neighbors in Glen Ellyn are all for him (and what a neighbor don't know about a man isn't worth knowing).

All these are good reasons but the one reason why he gets our vote and we believe should be elected is the program he has outlined if the choice of the people.

JUDGE S. L. RATHJE

out be otherwise. Add to this the fact that women are interesting themselves more than ever and that Mrs. Lottie Holman O'Neill, the DuPage county candidate, is making an excellent campaign, and you have the basis for something hard to figure out until the counting of the ballots.

Mrs. O'Neill's chances for the nomination are, we believe, very good. She is the DuPage county candidate. There are nine candidates in Will, all after the same job. That vote is almost certain to be badly split. With DuPage county "plumping" three for Mrs. O'Neill, that is voting ONLY for her, we should be able to put her

over and thus attain a two-fold purpose; giving DuPage county direct representation and electing a woman to the legislature.

In the county the race for the nomination for sheriff will probably be closer. With four candidates, and all of them apparently good men, it is hard to predict the outcome.

The contest between S. L. Rathje, of Wheaton and Arthur C. Marriott, of Lombard for the County Judgeship, is also close.

The rest are conceded, by old politicians, to be already won.

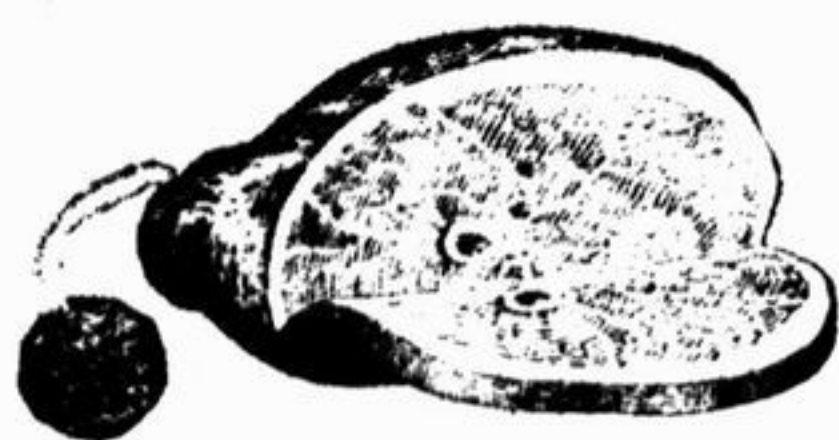

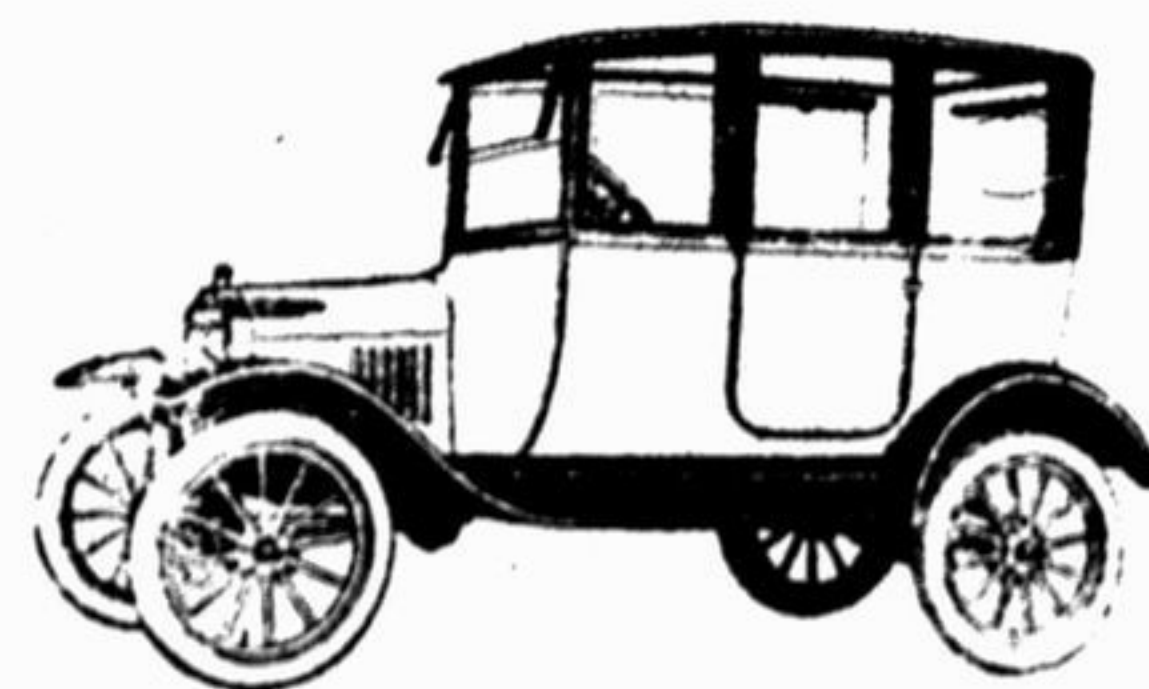

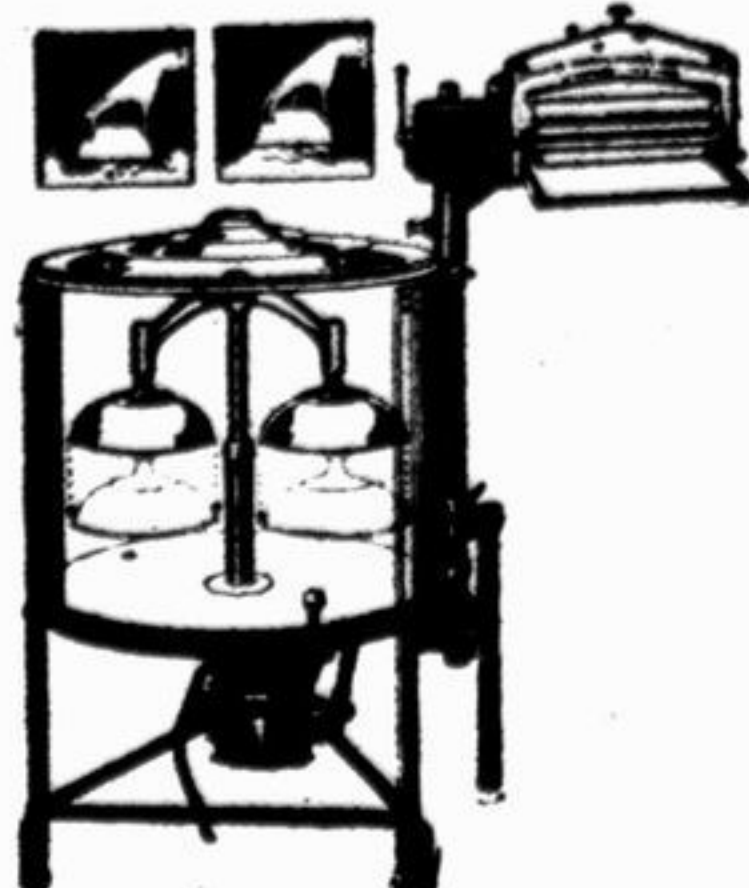
