

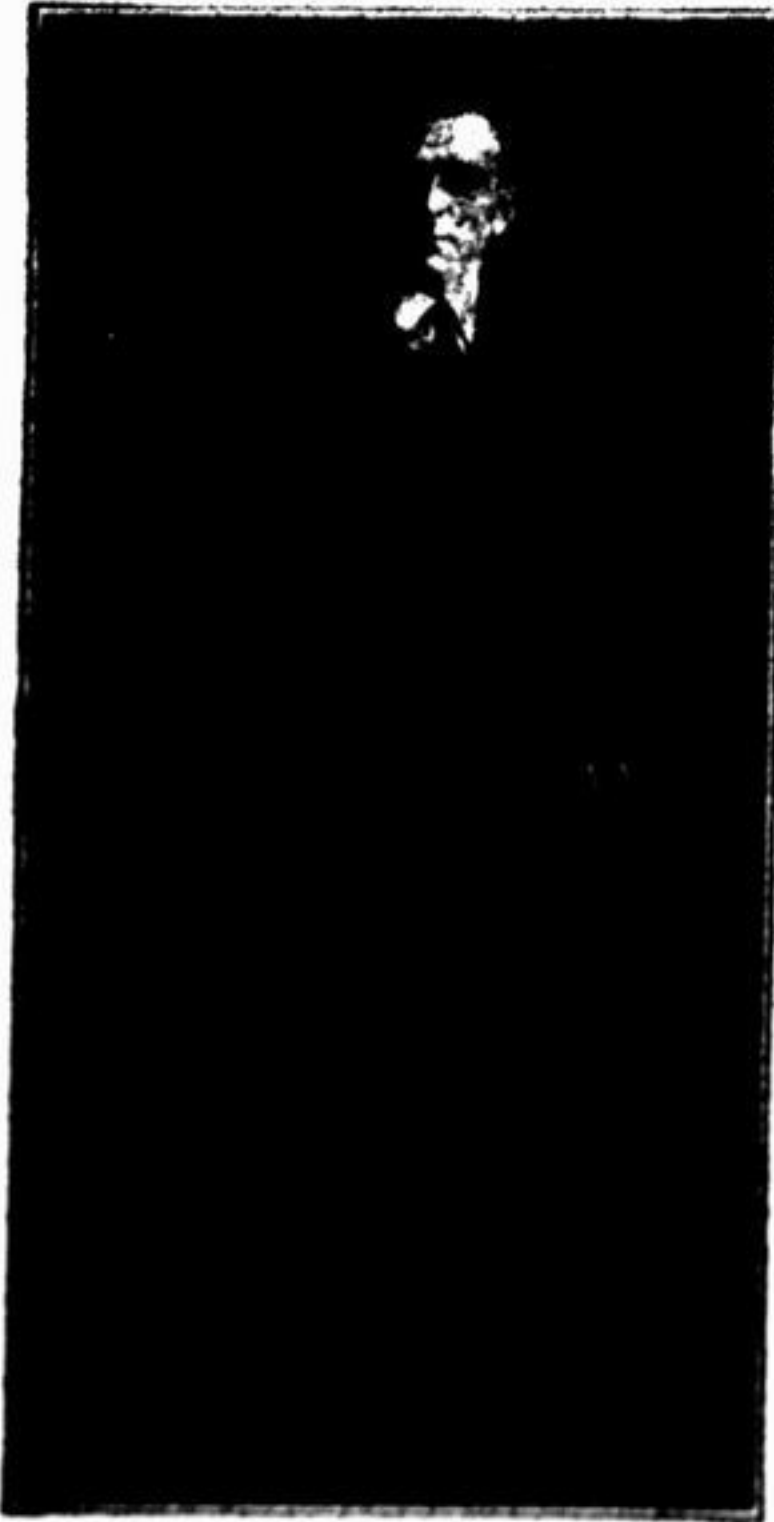
FIREMEN GIVE THANKS

Dear Fellow Citizens:
I take the liberty of addressing you in the hope of leaving some true light in and upon the so-called "New Spirit of DuPage", which we have all been reading so much about, and which has been written by the self-appointed Campaign Publicity Committee; and who would have you believe that they were appointed and speaking for the American Legion of DuPage County, whose by-laws provide that the Legion shall not take an active or interested part in political campaigns or politics.
Along about the first of the year I was considering the advisability of becoming a candidate for County Clerk of DuPage County. I had an

interview with CAPTAIN!! Gail Reed, a member of the so-called Campaign Publicity Committee, who informed me that undoubtedly the Committee would be of the opinion that there were already too many buck private in the campaign as candidates, and he earnestly urged me not to further consider being a candidate; that it was the desire of the Committee to center their efforts for MAJOR!! Marriott, whom they were urging to become a candidate for County Judge. He stated at that time that there would be an effort made to have the buck private who were candidates for County Treasurer and County Sheriff withdraw. I talked the matter over with my friends and subsequently announced my candidacy for County Clerk of DuPage County.

Shortly after, a committee of three buck private waited upon me, and after informing me that whatever I did they would be with me, said that they had been appointed by the "Campaign Publicity Committee" as a committee from the Legion to urge me to withdraw and cease dividing the public interest, which the so-called "Campaign Publicity Committee" wished to center upon MAJOR!! Marriott, candidate for County Judge. I reminded the boys that we were not taught how to back up or withdraw "Over There", and that I did not know how I could with honor withdraw now.

CAPTAIN!! Gail Reed of the above mentioned Committee then went to a friend of mine, who is actively supporting me, and told him that I was spending my money foolishly; that I was causing myself an unnecessary headache, and that the Committee and the Legion would not be in a position to do a great deal for us boys if I persisted in my candidacy, and continued to divide the public interest, which should be centered upon MAJOR!! Marriott; that I would kill myself politically with the Legion for-

ever, and that they would at no time feel inclined to do anything for me; that they had endorsed MAJOR!! Marriott for County Judge, but would do what they could to help the candidates for County Treasurer and County Sheriff.

Now, you see why the Committee saw fit to endorse those of the four ex-service men running, and withheld their endorsement from me.

They have not said that I was not qualified to fill the office to which I aspire. I am not running for the sole purpose of defeating some one. Neither am I a candidate to revolutionize things, or to reform any one or anything. I have the kindest regard for the present County Clerk of DuPage County, who is running to succeed himself. He has been a public official for twelve years, and I believe that he has discharged the duties of that office painstakingly and with honor and efficiency. This office does not belong to one man or any group of men. It belongs to the people of DuPage County, and I am a candidate because I can no longer follow my usual occupation, and must get in a line of work to which I can sit down. I am standing alone. Trusting I may have the support of the plain, fearless and independent voters.
