MORE SCHOOL FIGURES

As additional to the figures given a few weeks ago regarding salaries paid in various towns in our vicinity to teachers in grade and high schools I am of the opinion that the people of our district are more interested in what it has cost us in District 58 to maintain our schools, as the figures given in the previous article covered a period of four school years so the following figures of our cost will cover the same period.

It will be seen from these figures that four years ago our entire cost was \$30,202.00 while in 1920-21 it was \$57,547.00 and it is estimated to be \$59,810.00 for this current year, an increase of almost 100 per cent. The per capita cost running both high school and grades together in 1918-19 was about \$44.00; in 1919-20, \$63.00; in 1920-21, \$83.00; and in 1921-22, estimated, about \$75.00. A. C. MISKELLY.

ARBOR AND BIRD DAY APR. 14 Attention to Trees, Vines and Shrubs Is Urged

Arbor and Bird Day is set for Friday, April 14, according to a proclamation issued by Governor Small, and it will be observed throughout the state by the planting and care of trees, shrubs and vines about the homes, on the farms, along the highways and about public grounds. In observance of the day, the pamphlet, "Illinois Bird and Arbor Days," has been issued by Francis G. Blair, superintendent of public instruction. "The trees and the birds of any land constitute a part of its natural wealth and their aesthetic value is as highly important to the people as their economic value," said Mr. Blair in an introduction to the pamphlet.
