It is always the best practice to consult the directory before you make a telephone call unless you are positive of the number. When you call for the number of a telephone which has been discontinued, if the called subscriber has moved or the number has been changed, it is necessary for the operator to pass this call to another operator, who checks the number called and advises you in turn of the error. This necessarily slows the service.
The directory has a page on which numbers frequently called may be noted for ready reference. This list should be checked and corrected with each new issue of the directory and all other handy lists should be discarded.
