

MOCHEL BUTCHERS AND CUBS FINISH FIRST IN LEAGUES

Finals of the Bowling Business Men Show League Race was Hotly Contested.

Cord Tire Facts.
A 30 by 3 1/2 cord tire contains almost 3000 feet of cord or over a mile and a half. A 35 by 5 has over 30,000 feet of cord or over 5 1/2 miles. The cord, similar to medium-weight fishing line, is made of long fiber cotton, of far better grade than used in ordinary cotton goods. Each cord, insulated in rubber, is separated from the next by a layer of rubber insulating which gives additional strength. A standard make five-inch cord tire has 20 to 26 cords per inch and a strength in fabric excess alone in excess of 2,000 pounds to the square inch, irrespective of the strength given by other parts.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION ONE OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "SIGNS," CHAPTER XLIV.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF DOWNERS GROVE, That Section One of an Ordinance entitled "Signs," Chapter XLIV, be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Signs on Buildings—How Placed. No person shall place or cause to be placed, or suspend, or cause to be suspended, from any building over or into any street or sidewalk, any sign or sign board so that the same shall project from the wall or front of said building more than eight feet into the street or over the sidewalk, Barber poles used only for advertising barber shops may be constructed six feet in height, but shall not extend beyond the lot line of the building where said barber shop is located.

Such signs shall be securely fastened to such building, and no sign or sign board which, at its lowest part, is less than eight feet in height above the sidewalk, shall project into any street.

SECTION 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on its passage, approval and publication.
