AN ORDINANCE

To establish official time in the Vil lage of Downers Grove and accom plish daylight saving thereby, af-

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Downers Grove.

Section 1. Central standard time shall, from and after the year 1921 be the official time within the Village of Downers Grove for the transaction of all Village business; exsept that from 2:00 a. m. on the last Sunday in April in the year 1922 and every year thereafter official time for the Village of Downers Grove shall be advanced one hour and 2:00 a. m. on the last Sunday in September of the year 1922, and every year thereafter such official time shall by the retarding of one hour be returned to Central standard time and all legal or official proceedings Village Council and all off cial business of the Village shall be regulated thereby; and when, by or dinance, resolution or action of any muncipal officer or body, an act must be performed according to such official time.

Section 2. All clocks or other time pieces in or upon public buildings of other premises maintained at the ex-Village of Downers shall be set and run according official time as provided in I hereof, and it is hereby made the duty of the officer or other person having control and charge of such building or buildings and preto see that the said clocks or other timepieces are set and run in accordance with the official time as provided by this ordinance.

Section 3. All persons residing within the Village and all persons, firms or corporations doing business within the Village are hereby requested to set and run any clocks or other timepieces under their control within the city in accordance with the official time as provided by Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 4. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
