Canal Zone Girl, Visiting Here, is Hailed by Expert as Coming Swimming Star.

Miss Loretta Rush, the 15-year old girl from the Panama Canal zone, who is making her home with her grandparents, Mr and Mrs A. J. Wolf of East Maple avenue, has already made a name for herself in Chicago swimming circles.

In her first local appearance, Miss Rush, swimming with the Chicago Women's Swimming association, won the 40-yard crawl stroke race against the Elgin Y. W. C. A. She also won the springboard diving in very easy

fashion, although this was her first time in the water in some weeks.

Norman Ross, sporting editor of the Chicago Evening Journal, who saw her in action says she is a beautiful diver and is destined to make a name for herself in the swimming world.

The latest plans are that the Canal zone will send a women's swimming and athletic team to the Olympic games at Monte Carlo in August to show the world that Panama has the greatest team of girl athletes going.

Miss Rush will be a member of this team. She excels at running, and jumping beside her accomplishments in the water.

She was a member of the relay

team which lowered the world's standard for a quarter mile. In the same meet this 15-year-old lass cleared the bar at 4 feet, 6 inches.
