FAMOUS ATTORNEY ADDRESSES MILK PRODUCERS JUNE 6

Aaron Sapiro, Retained by Association to Speak to Farmers of Chicago District.

A huge mass meeting of milk producers of the Chicago milk marketing district will be held at the LaSalle Hotel, Chicago, next Tuesday afternoon, June 6. Aaron Sapiro, famous cooperative attorney, will give an address. The committee of Nine announces that every farmer interested in the future of dairy marketing in the Chicago district is invited. Mr. Sapiro aided in drawing up the new contract which has been approved by the Committee representing the producers of the territory and which will go into effect on September 1. If 6,000 are signed by that time. "The principle upon which we have been working," said Mr. Sapiro, "is that the producer is entitled to half the amount the consumer in Chicago pays for milk. He is at present getting about thirty per cent." Mr. Sapiro has organized forty-three producers' cooperative marketing companies, including the famous fruit cooperatives in California. No cooperative that he has organized has failed.

Rabbits and Mosquitoes.
Careful observations have been made in France, of the extent to which mosquitoes are attracted to domestic animals in preference to human beings. It was proved experimentally that mosquitoes have a strong predilection for the blood of rabbits, stronger than that of any other domestic animal. The discovery has been practically applied to many parts of France as a protection from mosquitoes, and particularly from those that carry germs of malaria and similar diseases.—Popular Mechanics Magazine.
