

LIBRARY BOARD ANNOUNCES HALL RENTAL PRICES

New Rules for Regulation of Borrowers Were Recently Adopted

The following schedule of rentals for Library hall was adopted by the Library Board at the last regular meeting:

Evenings — 8 to 10, \$5.00, plus \$2.00 if kitchen is used. 8 to 12, \$10, includes use of kitchen.

Afternoons — 2 to 6, \$4.00, plus \$2.00 if kitchen is used.

Mornings — 9 to 12, \$4.00, plus \$2.00 if kitchen is used.

Note — If dishes are used and left unwashed, an extra charge of \$2.00 will be made.

There were 597 new books added during the year making a total number of volumes in the Library of 4647. 23,978 books and magazines were circulated during the year. This is seven books for every person in the village.

\$166.26 was collected for fines on overdue books and \$147.54 from the "rented" collection.

There are 1311 borrowers' cards in use, 218 having been added during the year.

The new rules, recently adopted by the Library Board, are as follows:

Library Rules

The Library shall be open from 2:30 to 6:00 o'clock, Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; and from 2:30 to 9:00 o'clock Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, except legal holidays.

Any person above the age of 12 years, living in the village of Downers Grove, may become a card holder by filling out an application blank and having the same countersigned by a guarantor who is a resident and property owner of Downers Grove. Any person, 12 years or younger, may become a card holder by presenting an application signed by a parent or any responsible resident of Downers Grove.

Non-residents may be admitted to all the privileges of resident borrowers upon payment of \$1.00 per year. Transient persons, in absence of satisfactory security, may draw books from the Library by depositing the value of the books drawn with the Librarian, the money so deposited to be refunded upon the return of the

The reading room is free to everyone whether a card holder or not.

Each person, except a transient visitor, entitled to draw books from the Library, will be supplied with a membership card, containing name and residence of such person, which card must be presented whenever a book is drawn or returned.

The registered person or guarantor is in all cases responsible for books drawn by means of his card, by whomsoever presented.

Lost cards must be reported at once, and new ones will be issued without delay.

Five books may be drawn at one time on a card. Books not otherwise labeled, may be kept two weeks, and once renewed for the same time, unless by special request for study or reference work.

Periodicals may be drawn the same as books, kept one week, and once renewed for the same time.

A fine of two cents a day must be paid on each volume and periodical not returned on time, and no more books or periodicals will be issued to such persons until the fine is paid.

Encyclopedias and books of reference may be used only in the reading room.

Mutilation and writing in books is strictly prohibited, and all losses and injuries beyond reasonable wear must be promptly adjusted to the satisfaction of the Librarian.

As far as possible silence shall be observed in the Reading room.

It shall be the duty of all persons, having the use of the Library, to notify the Librarian of the existence of any contagious diseases in their residences or families, and for failure to do so, the privileges of the Library may be declared forfeited by the Board.

THOUSANDS OF FARMERS AT DE KALB JUNE 30

Celebration of Tenth Farm Bureau Birthday—Du Page County to Have Floats.

County Farm Bureaus in Illinois will celebrate at DeKalb June 30. The occasion will mark the end of the first ten year lap of Farm Bureau work in this state.

Farmers will knock off work for a day and take a well-earned vacation, driving to DeKalb to enjoy a real gala day.

As to the celebration itself. No time or effort is being spared to make this the best ever. In the morning three of the best known speakers in America will talk to farm people. At two o'clock will be staged the greatest agricultural pageant ever held.

Two thousand people from Illinois Farm Bureaus will take part in the cast, giving a living picture of Farm Bureau work from the beginning up to today. We are told that even a peep will be taken into the future. The pageant is being developed by Miss Nina B. Lamkin, a trained pageant director.

Some Farm Bureau members are planning to arrive at DeKalb the night before the celebration and the local committee under the guidance of S. E. Bradt, chairman, is planning to provide lodging or tents for such visitors. The committee should be notified a week in advance.

Others will come by special trains

to DeKalb. Low round trip rates are being secured by representatives of the Illinois Agricultural Association. From 15,000 to 20,000 farm people are expected to attend the celebration, as it is a much more attractive event than the annual I. A. A. picnic.
