The drive for Near East Relief funds goes on continually. For the past five years the Relief has been able to provide for these little folks in Armenia at a cost of less than five per cent, according to their annual reports to Congress. It is encouraging to know that over 100,000 little children have been cared for for another year and that the money raised here has been a little drop in the big bucket-full which went to the saving of human lives.

Any money sent in will, of course, be credited to our town and county quota.
