**"FORWARD FARM
BUREAU" PAGEANT
AT DE KALB JUNE 30**

Many DuPage County People Take Part at Farm Bureau Celebration at De Kalb.

Many DuPage county farmers are going to DeKalb, Illinois, June 30, to attend the greatest agricultural event ever staged. That day will celebrate the end of the first ten years of Farm Bureau work, and the beginning of a new lap with still greater possibilities in view.

A big Farm Bureau Pageant will be one of the features of the day. Nearly fifty people and fifty farm floats will take part in this wonderful out-door play.

The celebration will be held on the large campus of the Northern Illinois Teachers' College at DeKalb, and an audience of 20,000 people can be taken care of nicely.

Counties which notify the local committees early enough will have space reserved for their delegations.

DuPage county members plan to drive to DeKalb, leaving the court house at Wheaton at 8:30 a. m., standard time, June 30, 1922. Bill says to take advantage of the first rainy day to grease up the car all ready to start. Advisor Carneross should know all those who expect to go, so proper arrangements can

be made for the trip. Please phone Mr. Carneross your intentions some time this week so that the farm bureau may supply you with a banner for your car.

The following people from DuPage county are leaders of groups from the county who will take part in the presentation of "Forward, Farm Bureau," a pageant to be given in connection with the Farm Bureau Decennial Celebration at DeKalb, June 30th: C. J. Rieck, Mrs. Frank Fraley, Mrs. Matt Fisher, Frank McCabe, Mrs. Chas. Putnam, John Warren, Geo. B. Goss, Mrs. W. W. Klett and E. A. Carneross.

The pageant, under the able direction of Miss Nina Lamkin will present a dramatization of the birth, growth and development of the Farm Bureau movement in Illinois, from the time the first small meeting was held at Henry Park's farm, near Genoa, to the present. This will cover a period of ten years showing how the Farm Bureau idea developed and how the Farm Bureau as an organization works.

Miss Lamkin has held rehearsals in thirteen counties from which the cast of around 2000 farm folks will come. Most of these people will take part in a big final rehearsal on June 24th at DeKalb when all the various divisions will be brought together.

In addition to the presentation of the work of the Farm Bureau there will be shown on the stage the evolution of the ordinary farm home into a "model farm home." Miss Lam-

kin has met with a hearty cooperation wherever she has held rehearsals.

The pageant will be given on the grounds of the Northern Illinois State Normal School in a beautiful setting.

In addition to the pageant, visitors to the celebration will hear an excellent program of speakers in the forenoon. Among the speakers who have been secured for the day are: Hon. J. A. O. Preus, Governor of Minnesota, J. R. Howard, President of the American Farm Bureau Federation, and Dean Davenport of the

College of Agriculture, University of Illinois.

A crowd estimated at 15,000 to 20,000 is expected to come to DeKalb by train or automobile on Decennial Day. For the benefit of the Farm Bureau members who wish to travel by rail the transportation department of the Illinois Agricultural Association has secured a fare and a half round trip rate, on most of the Illinois roads.

The committee at DeKalb will do all in their power to take care of the visitors who will help celebrate the Farm Bureau Decennial.
