

COUNTY TUBERCULOSIS ASSN. REPORTS DEATHS

Claims There are 3,000 Living Cases in DuPage County at the Present Time.

Since the close of school Miss M. Elizabeth Seymour, of the DuPage County Tuberculosis Association, has been finding out the number of deaths in the county from tuberculosis. This study shows without a doubt that more preventive work along all health lines is greatly needed if this county is to keep up with the other counties in the state in this crusade for better health.

In 1918 there were 56 deaths, in 1919 30, in 1920 there were 31 and in 1921 there were 36. This gives a total of 153 deaths in four years.

At Framingham, Mass., where a tuberculosis demonstration has been carried on for the past five years Miss Seymour stated that they found there were fifteen active cases to every death. Using that then for our criterion would give us approximately 3,000 living cases of tuberculosis in this county during the last four years.

It must be remembered that this is a preventable disease, but before it can be prevented every individual must cooperate to overcome this common enemy. This can be done by education; especially about cause, prevention and treatment of tuberculosis, by having periodical medical examinations by a competent physician; by correcting physical defects; by providing a pure milk supply; and by having more public health nurses and living up to the health laws of rest, good food, exercise, fresh air and sunshine and keeping the mind happy and contented.

The greater number of deaths occurs, as is usual, in the economic ages 15-45. It would be almost impossible to estimate the economic loss to the county just from this one disease, but from the deaths in the last 4 years, \$300,000 is a low estimate. How much is this community spending for health?

A great amount is spent for better roads, for better cattle, for better farming conditions along all lines, but for health funds are lacking.

A NEW IDEA IN EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ILL.

Motion Pictures Shown at St. Joseph's in Drive for Catholic Foundation.

Dear Mr. Editor:

On Sunday evening at the St. Joseph's Church hall, the two reels of film of the University of Illinois, used in conjunction with the "drive" of the Catholic Foundation now in progress, were shown to an appreciative audience. The pictures serve to give a good idea of the bigness of our State University, as well as showing the necessity of our Catholic people duplicating the pace set by the Methodists, who have established there the Wesleyan Foundation at an expense of \$3,500,000. So, the \$1,000,000 aimed at in the present

campaign seems to be modest, and as was brought out by the writer in explaining the movement, certainly it is one eminently laudable—the university in fact having done, for all of the religious bodies, an unprecedented thing, namely: give students credits toward graduation, the same as for Mathematics, for example, of direct instruction in the religious faiths of the parents—this, however, based on two requirements: first, that instead of dealing with any particular church organization, as such, that it should be duly incorporated under the laws of Illinois as an educational institution; and secondly, that such institution, or Foundation, should be properly endowed, in order to promote its greater permanence, and to guarantee high-class talent for the instructors. As Dr. Kinley, the president of the university well states "There is no complete education without religious training," and it is, therefore, a source of gratification to us all that the first great step in this direction has been taken by Illinois. Other states will doubtless

follow suit, as the normal parent of any religious faith, is naturally anxious that due consideration be given to so fundamental a matter, and yet in the past it has not been so, nor is

it elsewhere at present, save in our own University of Illinois.
