

DU PAGE CO. HOLSTEIN COWS AT TESTING PLANT

Only Best Cows are Admitted to the Test—3 Entered from DuPage County.

The following pure bred Holsteins from DuPage County are making a good showing at the Holstein Testing Plant operated by the Holstein Association of Illinois.

Only the best cows in the state are admitted to the plant and but sixty can be taken at a time. They are under the care of an expert feeder to test them out for their production ability so as to determine whether to keep their offspring for foundation stock.

Laura Madrigal Sarcastic Lad 186836, owned by John Rathbun, of Lombard, produced in 184 days 15307.9 pounds milk and 616.92 pounds butter. Her production for the month of May was 2366.1 pounds milk and 85.79 pounds butter.

Colantha Coronis Cornucopia DeKol 319625, owned by E. E. Bain of Lisle, produced in 128 days 10087.5 pounds of milk and 417.88 pounds of butter. Her production for May was 2339.9 pounds milk and 93.6 pounds butter.

Alcanta Crystal Pontiac 340754, owned by C. O. McChesney, of West Chicago, produced in 150 days 10628 pounds of milk and 419.03 pounds of butter. Her production for the month of May was 1762.8 pounds milk and 70.77 pounds butter.

When we recall that the average cow of DuPage County produces only about 3500 pounds milk and 150 pounds of butter in a year, you can readily see that these cows are worth more than the ordinary cow. Laura Madrigal Sarcastic Lad has produced as much as four do in a whole year; Colantha Coronis Cornucopia DeKol three, and Alcanta Crystal Pontiac more than three, all with much less than one year's production. These cows will be bred to King Colantha Aggie Clothilde 249457, the fine bull at the Plant.

223 DISABLED VETERANS TRAIN AT ILLINOIS U

Received Vocational Training Under Guidance of U. S. Veterans' Bureau.

Two hundred and twenty-three disabled veterans of the World War received vocational training at the University of Illinois the past year under the guidance of the U. S. Veterans' Bureau, according to a statement made today by Dean Kendrick C. Babcock, University Counselor for the veterans.

These men registered in all the regular courses of the University, and special courses in Agriculture were given solely for their benefit. The University provides special funds for the use of the Vocational Students. These are used when Federal checks are delayed.

"The Vocational Students are a fine hard-working bunch of young men," Dean Babcock states. "They are absorbing their training rapidly, and several who have completed their courses are now holding responsible positions."

In answer to a question about the post-war attitude of the men, he said: "I can't see any great difference in them. Former tendencies in any direction seem to have been strengthened by the war experiences, but that is all."

Mr. F. C. Speidel, Co-ordinator for the U. S. Veterans' Bureau stated that he did not know of any other group of vocational students who were so well satisfied, or who were proceeding more satisfactorily in their training than those at the University of Illinois.

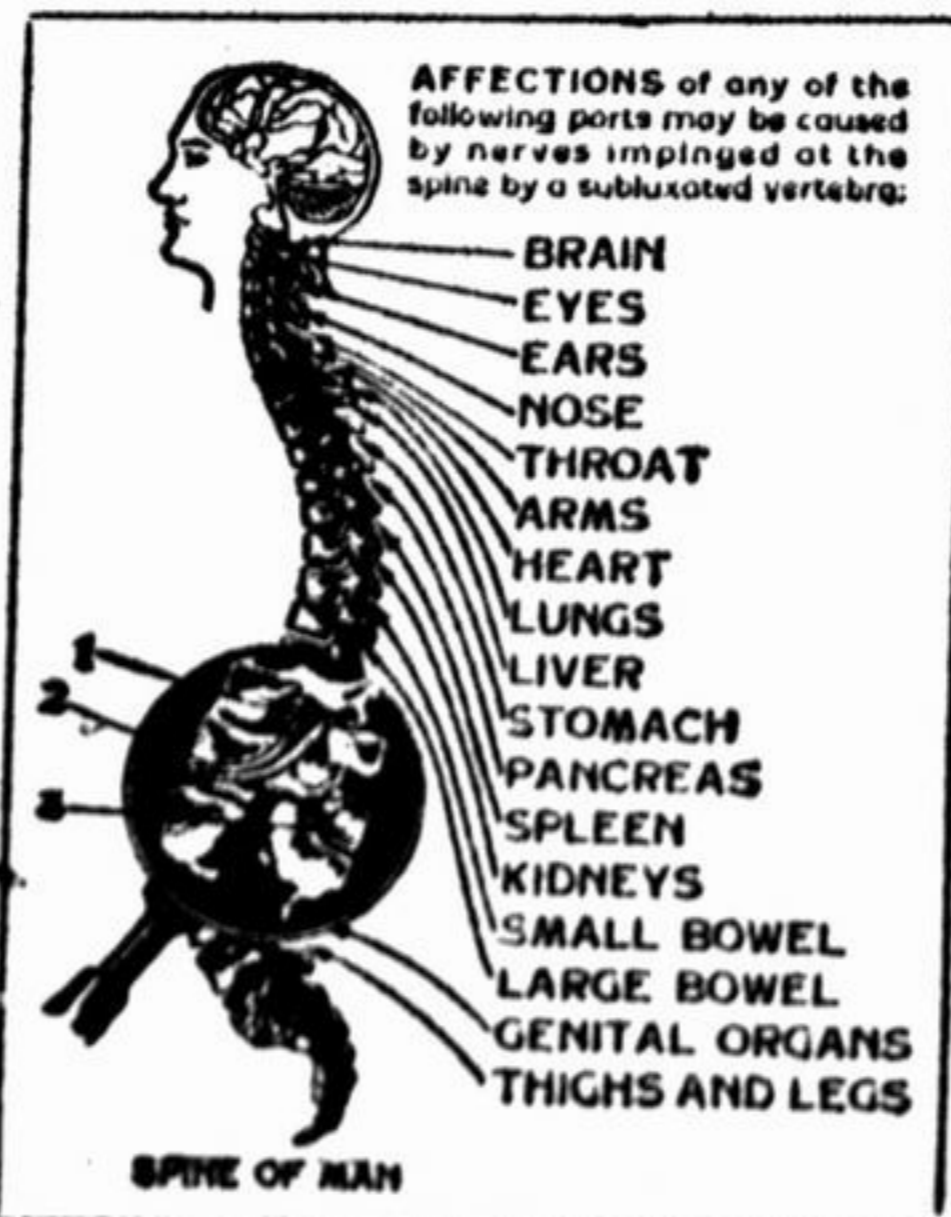
