**TENT CITY FOR FAIR VISITORS**

**Central States Exposition Will Provide Camping Facilities.**

Visitors to the great Central States Fair and Exposition, to be held at Aurora, Ill., August 18-20, will be able to remain on the grounds the entire nine days if they desire. A tented city, covering five acres, is to be located inside the park and tents may be secured for the entire nine days and nights, or for one or more days.

A family of five can lease a five room tent for the nine days for \$22.50, while a two room tent can be had for \$7.50, a three room for \$10.00 and a four room, with hallway, for \$21.50.

A charge of 50 cents will be made automobiles and horse drawn vehicles for parking space.




