**ZONING LAW IN THE MAKING FOR DOWNERS GROVE**

(Continued from Page 1)

The members of the Commission have not yet been appointed but will be announced later.

Following is the ordinance:

**AN ORDINANCE CREATING A ZONING COMMISSION BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF DOWNERS GROVE, ILLINOIS:**  
SECTION 1. There is hereby created a Commission of five (5) members to be known as the "Zoning Commission." Said Commission shall consist of the Mayor and three (3) additional members holding no other office or employment in the Village Government, to be appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Village Council.

The Mayor shall appoint a member of said Commission as the Chairman thereof. Officers of the Village who are hereby made ex-officio members of said Commission shall receive no extra compensation for their services, as such, and the other members shall serve without compensation.

SECTION 2. The said Zoning Commission shall have the following duties:

To carry out the purpose and intent of the Illinois Zoning Law approved June 28, 1921, entitled "An Act to confer certain additional powers upon city councils in cities and presidents and boards of trustees in villages and incorporated towns concerning buildings and structures, the intensity of use of lot areas, the classification of trades, industries, buildings, and structures, with respect to location and regulation, the creation of districts of different classes, and the establishment of regulations and restrictions applicable thereto."

To employ a competent Zoning Expert and such other employees as may be essential for the purpose of preparing the maps and ordinance in pursuance of the powers granted in said Act.

To arrange for conducting and holding preliminary hearings also formal public hearings in accordance with the provisions of said Zoning Act.
