

ORDINANCE NO. 55

An Ordinance making appropriations for all corporate purposes of the Village of Downers Grove, for the Fiscal Year commencing May 1, 1922, and ending April 30, 1923.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Downers Grove, Illinois:

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated for all corporate purposes of the Village of Downers Grove, Illinois, for the fiscal year of said Village commencing May 1, 1922, and ending April 30, 1923 the aggregate sum of \$73,950.00, to be provided for by the general tax levy for the year 1922 and from other sources of revenue. The object and purposes for which said sum is appropriated for each object and purpose shall be as follows:

SECTION 2. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$4,900.00, for the Department of Public Affairs. The specific items and objects and purposes for which said sum is appropriated being as follows, to-wit: For the maintenance and improvement of parks and parkways \$ 1,000.00 For the maintenance of Public Library 2,200.00 For printing and stationery 1,700.00

SECTION 3. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$22,050.00, for the Department of Accounts and Finance. The specific items and objects and purposes for which said sum is appropriated being as follows, to-wit: For the salaries of city officers, except as herein otherwise provided \$ 9,000.00 For auditing books and accounts of the City 300.00 For special assessments 1,000.00 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses 3,500.00 Village indebtedness, Principal 5,000.00 Village indebtedness, Interest 3,250.00

SECTION 4. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,000.00, for the Department of Public Health and Safety. The specific items and objects and purposes for which said sum is appropriated being as follows, to-wit: For the maintenance of the Board of Health \$ 500.00 For the maintenance of the Fire Department 2,000.00 For the maintenance of the Police Department, including salaries of special officers 500.00

SECTION 5. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$11,000.00 for the Department of Streets and Public Improvements. The specific items and objects and purposes for which said sum is appropriated being as follows, to-wit: For the construction, maintenance and repair of streets, alleys, avenues, sidewalks and retaining walls, including the salaries of employees \$ 4,000.00 For the maintenance, repair the Board of Local Improvements, including engineering and expenses attending the supervision of the construction of public improvements by special assessments 5,000.00 For the maintenance, repair and improvement of the sewer system 2,000.00

SECTION 6. That there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$33,000.00, for the Department of Public Property. The specific items and objects and purposes for which said sum is appropriated being as follows, to-wit: For the maintenance, repair improvement and operation of the Municipal Electric Light and Water Plant and Systems, except as herein otherwise provided, and including the salaries of the Chief Engineer, and all employees \$28,000.00 For the maintenance and repair of water mains and hydrants 1,200.00 For the maintenance, repair and improvement of other public property, including alterations and additions to the Village Hall building 3,000.00 For the purchase and rental of real estate 800.00

SECTION 7. That this ordinance shall be known as Ordinance No. 55 of the Village of Downers Grove, Illinois, under the Commission Form of Municipal Government.

FARMER BOYS TO CAMP AT AURORA

Will Be Given Free Instructions at Big Fair.

Farm boys from all parts of Illinois will attend a school of instruction at the Central States Fair and Exposition at Aurora, Ill., August 18 to 26. Boys over fourteen and under twenty-one will be eligible. Applications for admittance must be made to the farm adviser in the home county.

The camp will be under the direction of the Y. M. C. A. and Junior Extension service of the University of Illinois. A complete program of agricultural instruction and recreation has been planned. The only charge will be \$5 for each boy for meals during the nine days. The camping facilities and instruction by the university men will be free.

ENTRIES CLOSE.

Dates for the closing of entries at the Central States Fair and Exposition, to be held at Aurora, Ill., August 18 to 26, are:

Monday, July 31—Swine, cattle, sheep and horses.

Monday, August 7—Agriculture, fine arts, boys' and girls' club exhibits, and better babies' conference.

Wednesday, August 9—Poultry and pets, textile fabrics, handpainted china.

Tuesday, August 15—Culinary and pantry stores, dairy products, horticulture, floriculture, etc., and all other departments not specifically mentioned.

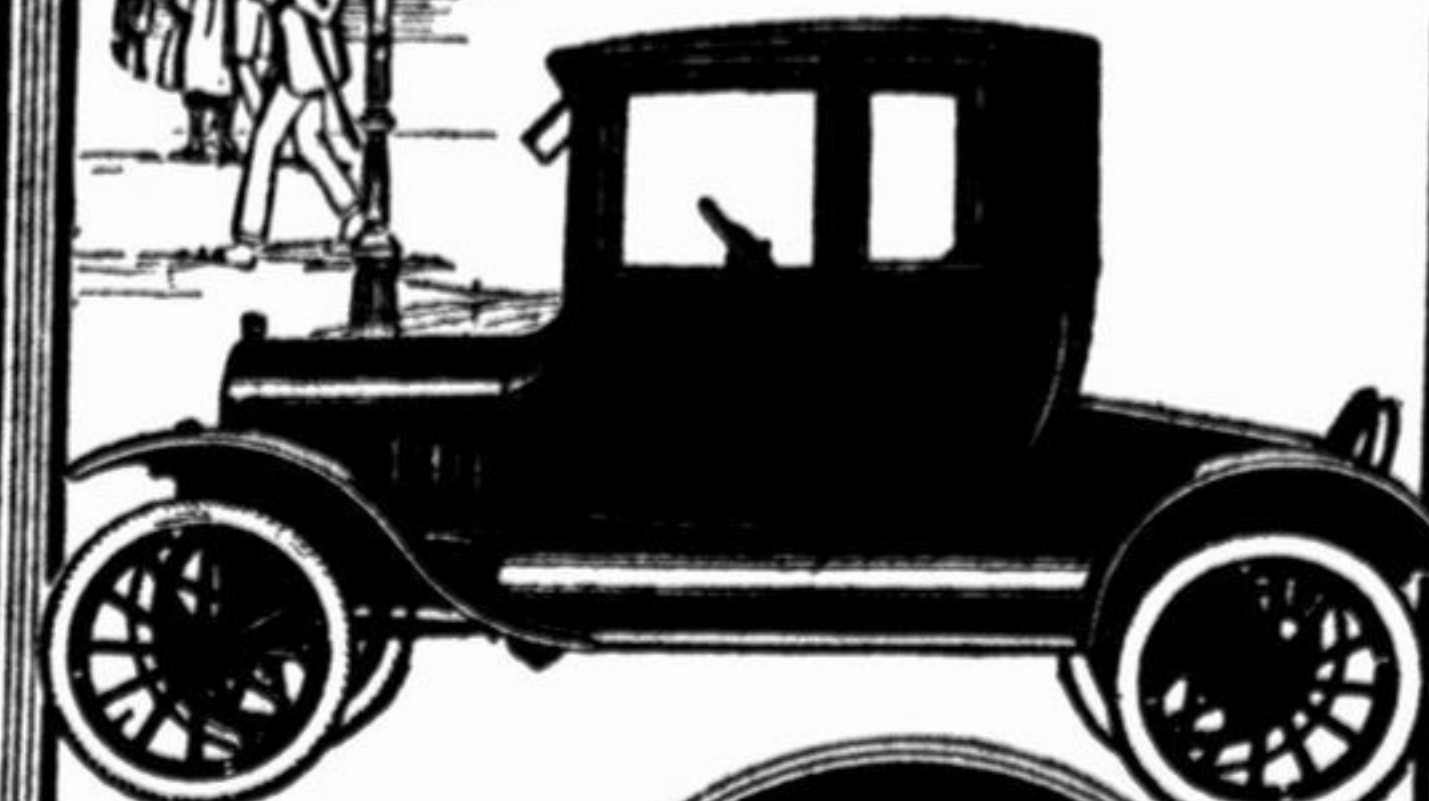
