DEADLY ENEMY TO CHILD LIFE

Many people fail to recognize that whooping cough is a communicable disease, and, as such, is subject to quarantine, both as to cases and contacts, as are other communicable diseases. Notwithstanding the fact that the State Department of Health has frequently emphasized the necessity of protecting children against all forms of communicable diseases, many people regard whooping cough as one of the "necessary" diseases of childhood, and with resignation worthy of a better cause operate on the theory that the sooner children "have it" and are "over with it," the better.

Rosenau, the great American authority, says: "There is no natural immunity to whooping cough; all are susceptible. Whooping cough at one time or another affects almost every member of a community and causes 10,000 or more deaths yearly in this country alone. The greatest susceptibility is between the ages of six months and five years. After five years susceptibility decreases with age."

Smallpox is a dreaded disease, yet there are more deaths from whooping cough than from smallpox by far. When it is considered that the great-

est mortality from whooping cough occurs among babies under two years of age the necessity of protecting young children against the disease becomes apparent. An idea of the prevalence of the two diseases may be secured from the statistics for the latter half of 1921 when there were 574 cases of smallpox as against 4,495 cases of whooping cough reported to the State Department of Health.

Many instances of the violation of quarantine in cases of whooping cough have recently been reported to the department. In one case, a woman desiring to attend some social function, is reported to have removed the "Whooping cough" sign from her residence. For public safety the rules of quarantine must be observed in this as in other communicable diseases. Along this line Rosenau says in part:

"Whooping cough should be reported, houses placarded, and the patient isolated. * * * The most important thing is to keep babies and young children from having the disease. Delaying the age incidence will materially decrease the mortality. Particular care should be taken during and for several months following convalescence to prevent the development of tuberculosis."
