Independence square in Philadelphia was the site of America's first zoological garden. It was there that Charles Wilson Peale, in 1791, transferred the museum which for a decade previous he had maintained in his home, Third and Lombard streets. The Philosophical society, at Sixth and Chestnut streets, gave him permission to use its building for his large collection of portraits of men of the Revolution. He started the zoological garden in the rear of the building. An eagle was among the living specimens. Above its cage was an inscription: "Feed me well and I will live a hundred years,"


